According to the census returns the increase of population in this State has been about 23 per cent., which is nearly up to the average. Many others Southern States have even exceeded this.

A. S. Hewitt, though a manufacturer of steel rails, is for low tariff, and is willing to have the duty placed at once to \$14 a ton. He says that one steel rail firm with a capital of \$2,000,000 last year made a profit of \$2,000,000.

LATEST census bulletin issued show that of the total population of the United States (56,155,720) 25,518,820 are males, and 24,636,905 are females, showing an excess of 871,917 males. There are 43,475,840 natives, and 6,678,943 foreigners.

There are 43,492,979 whites; 6,580,793 colored; 105,455 Chinese; 148 Japanese, and 66,407 Indians.

The Protestant Episcopal Church of Maryland did itself a gross injustice and weakened the cause of Christianity by refusing recently to ordain a colored student from a Northern theological seminary.

Reports received by State Superintendent Cook for this year show that the scholastic population of the State is White, 205,555; colored, 130,132. Total 335,730, against a total population of 514,869 for last year, or a decrease of 19,182. The number of private schools in the State is 197; teachers employed; 1328; pupils enrolled during the year, 35,074; average daily attendance, 25,820; average cost of tuition per month, \$1.64. The number of county institute held during the year was 198. The decrease of 19,182 in scholastic population during a single year is something which requires explanation.

THE CONKING SYSTEM. It is asserted that the administration has, after careful thought, decided upon fixed rules for governing appointments in a state. If the office is limited to a congressional district, the member of the house from that district, if a Republican, shall have the privilege of naming the appointee. If the jurisdiction of the office extends beyond a congressional district, such as United States marshalships, district attorneyships, land offices, internal revenue and custom-house collectorship, and post-offices in large cities, the appointee to be recommended by the senators from the state, if they are Republicans. This is the Conking plan out and out, and it is from Conking that Arthur borrows it. Mr. Hayes and President Garfield did not and would not recognize the right of senators and representatives to name the appointees in their state.

One thing deserves to be noted: In all cases the recommendation for appointment under the new system is to come from Republican senators and representative, if there be any; if the senators and representatives happen to be Democrats, no attention is to be paid to their wishes. This is the way the administration reform the civil service so as to place it above politics.
