Credit of Narrow Gauge Railroads.

The important statement made in the Memphis Appeal in regard to the credit of narrow gauge railroads, will attract the attention of all who are satisfied doubters. While broad gauge roads find it difficult to negotiate their bonds for \$1,000,000 per mile, the narrow gauge companies have no difficulty in negotiating their bonds for six or ten thousand dollars a mile; because their earnings will be as much as those of the more expensive roads. Seventy miles east of Memphis the Ripley narrow gauge, now only twenty-six miles in length diverges southward from the Memphis and Charleston road. It has been built and equipped within six months for ten thousand dollars per mile, and such is the approval of this system of road-building, that when the President of the company wanted six thousand dollars for each mile of the road, with which to pay for the iron, New York capitalists insisted that it was quite as easy to secure a loan of ten thousand a mile, and the mortgage was executed accordingly, and the road is perfectly equipped.

Greely's Letter of Acceptance. The committee having notified him of his nomination by the Baltimore Convention, he replied in the following language:

GENTLEMEN:—Upon mature deliberation it seems to me that I should give your letter of the 19th inst., some more than a hasty and unconsidered answer. I find myself, in fact, a hazy, unprepared, and unready man, who had been prominently, pointedly, opposed to your party in the earnest and angry controversies of the last forty years. It is essentially noteworthy that many of you originally preferred that the Liberal Republicans should present another candidate for President, and you were more readily united with me in the support of ADAMS and TURNBULL, DAVIS or BROWN. It is well known that I owe my adoption of Republicanism to the fact that I had already been nominated at Cincinnati, and that a concentration of forces upon any single ticket had proved impracticable. Gratitude for your concurrence in the Cincinnati convention; certain as I am that you would not thus have been cured, had you not deemed me unworthy of the honor, and that the circumstances calculated to inflame vanity or selfish conceit. But that your convention saw fit in appointing the Cincinnati ticket, to re-affirm the Cincinnati platform, is to me a source of the profoundest satisfaction. That body was constrained to take this important step by the necessity of unity, and I am glad to see that you have accepted the candidates of the Liberal Republicans upon ground entirely its own, or it might have been a source of regret to me that the national convention did not have adopted your platform, without adopting any platform whatever.
