Lincoln County Fair. The fair at this place last week was not as well attended as in previous years, but the display of stock is said to have been the best ever had here.

A move was made Saturday evening to organize a stock fair association, fifteen hundred dollars being subscribed. If fifty men will each subscribe \$100 the grounds can be bought and put in excellent condition. Circumstances are such that the grounds will pass out of the hands of the present holder, and can be purchased for \$3,000. It is the most favorably situated of any place we know for this purpose—on the W. and A. railroad and at the terminus of the narrow-gauge road, being just at the edge of the corporate limits, bounded on two sides by Norris creek and containing twenty acres. It has advantages that cannot be had at any other place. We hope an association will be organized that will make the Lincoln county fair second to none in the State.
