Storing Potatoes.

As the time has arrived for potatoes to be harvested, I wish to say to those who have them to harvest, to put them in barrels as the best mode of disposing of them.

Suggestions About Wheat Culture. A practice which steadily gains favor with farmers wherever introduced, must its success to the fact that general and long continued experience proves its value.

If the soil was "as dry as an ash heap" when plowed after harvest, and little or no rain has fallen on it, using the roller just after the last harrowing will be highly beneficial.

The best time for sowing wheat in this latitude is between the 10th and 15th of September, a period when the heat of summer usually has passed, and the cool weather of autumn begins.

The larger the berry sown the more vigorous will be the early growth of the plant. Hence it pays to winnow the seed carefully and sieve out the small kernels.


