Grain and Provisions. The grain market during the week has been quiet with but few any transactions.

The flour market continues easy, the market being well stocked and prices are ranging low. Several heavy transactions were had during the week at quotations.

The corn market is steady, and corn is only in moderate demand at figures given below. There is no activity in the egg market, there being no demand for shipping purposes.

The bacon trade is rather dull and quiet, little of it being offered while there is only a slight demand.
