The Ohio Election.
COLUMBUS, O., October 10.—The returns from the State election held to-day are coming in rapidly. The gains and losses reported are based upon a comparison with the vote for Governor in 1881, when the Republican majority was 24,309. There are 1,967 precincts in the State. The returns from 192 precincts show a narrow Republican gain of 2,920.

Murder and Mob Law.
EVANSVILLE, IND., October 11.—At ten minutes past two o'clock this morning about one hundred mounted men, from Posey County, quietly surrounded the county jail, awoke the sheriff and demanded of him the keys of the jail. They then went to the cell of Redman, who is imprisoned for wife murder, took him out and, putting him in a buggy, drove off with him. Upon their leaving, a number of shots were fired and the fire bells rung, for the purpose of notifying the police, but before their arrival the squad was out of sight, going down the street leading to the Mt. Vernon road. The sheriff was warned only a moment before the mob arrived at the jail, and before he could get to the outer door to lock it, the mob was on him, and held him prisoner. The police, on arriving, commenced firing down the street in the direction taken by the mob, and one of them, named Dave Murphy, living near Redman's home, in Posey County, was killed. As the mob was moving off with Redman, a fire engine ran against the buggy in which the prisoner was seated, upsetting it, when the order was given to kill Redman on the spot, and one of the mob seized a sledge hammer and dealt Redman a powerful blow on the head, felling him to the ground. At this point, Chief Pritchett arrived on the scene. One of the mob ran up to him and said, "Go away from here, Pritchett; we do not want to kill you," at the same time snapping a revolver in his face, but his hand was knocked up before the weapon was discharged. By this time several officers were on the ground, and they, without orders from their superiors opened fire on the mob, but life was extinct. The mob, on leaving the scene, separated, and everything was done to avoid the officers.

Yellow Fever.
PENSACOLA, FLA., October 10.—The developments of the last few days have shown the fallacy of the hopes entertained of the early abatement of the epidemic. Within three days 175 new cases and 10 deaths have been reported. The report for to-day shows 50 new cases, besides 6 of other fevers, and 3 deaths. The total number of cases to date is 1,350, and the total deaths 115. Some of the new cases are of an aggravated character, and there is no reason to hope for a diminution of the death rate. The distress of the community is very great, especially among the impoverished negroes thrown out of employment. The demands upon the Board of Health are increasing. They have made a formal appeal to the country at large for aid, and their contributions have been chiefly from Mobile, Montgomery, Memphis, and a few other places in this and adjacent States. The insufficiency of funds is becoming alarming. The pay of the nurses has been cut down, and other expenses curtailed to the lowest point. The situation is serious, and appeals loudly to the sympathies of humane and benevolent of every class and denomination. Contributions should be made to D. G. Brent, chairman executive committee of board of health. The weather is hot and unsettled.

Irish National Land League.
BUFFALO, N. Y., October 10.—The officers of the Irish National Land League have issued a circular to the public relative to the statement which has been made that the Land League is no longer in existence. They emphatically protest against this statement, and declare the League to be in full and active strength. The circular closes as follows: "The statement that the Land League no longer exists calls for our emphatic protest with Mr. Parnell and his co-laborers at the head. It will continue until its mission is accomplished, let no man be misled. Let every man, who has ever believed in its purposes, or contributed to its advancement, rally to its support united and hopeful until its final triumph is assured."

WASHINGTON.
WASHINGTON, October 10.—The National Board of Health is informed that there have been 1,900 cases of yellow fever and 113 deaths in Pensacola, up to the 10th inst.
WASHINGTON, October 10.—The President has appointed Henry H. Morgan, of Louisiana, as secretary of the American legation in Mexico.
WASHINGTON, October 10.—The total amount of 3 per cent. bonds issued to date is \$259,370,500. Total amount in annual interest by exchange of 3 per cent. into 3 per cent. is \$1,296,852,500. A few applications for new bonds have been received since the exchange was completed on September 20th, but they will not be considered until after November 1st. 3 per cent. bonds thereafter issued will only bear interest from November 1st.

NEW YORK, October 10.—Congressional nominations were made in the various States to-day as follows: W. S. Seymour, by the Democrats of the 4th Connecticut district; E. F. Stone, by the Republicans of the 7th Massachusetts district; Wm. W. Eaton by the Democrats of 1st Connecticut district; H. G. Burleigh, by the Republicans of the 17th New York district; Wm. McAuliffe, by the Democrats of the 7th New Jersey district; ex-Congressman Henry, by the Republicans of the 10th Pennsylvania district.

Democracy—1st district. John F. Fullett; 2d, Isaac M. Jordan; 4th, Benjamin F. Lefevre; 5th, George H. Henry; 10th, Frank H. Hill; 13th, George L. Converse; 16th, Bernat Wilkins; 21st, Martin A. Forman; Total, 8.
Republicans—3d district. Emanuel S. Schmitz; 8th, J. Warren Keifer; 11th, J. W. McCormick; 14th, R. A. Horn; 17th, J. T. Uptegrad; 18th, W. McKinley, jr.; 19th, Ezra B. Taylor; 20th, A. S. McClure; Total, 8.
This leaves five districts doubtful. Of these it is probable that James E. Campbell, Democrat, is elected in the 7th district, and Horst, Republican, in the 12th.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, October 11.—Seven hundred and sixty-three precincts show a net Democratic gain of 24,380, indicating a Democratic majority in the State of 35,500.
CINCINNATI, October 11.—Complete, but unofficial returns from Hamilton County, show the following Democratic majority: Newsom, Secretary of State, 10,650; Okey, Judge of the Supreme Court, 9,800; Weibel, Board of Public works, 9,754; Hawkins, sheriff, 111; Dutton, clerk, 337; Pugh, prosecuting attorney, 2,636; Muscort, coroner, 2,644; Robenstern, recorder, 2,728; Kuhl, county commissioner, 3,177; Cosgrove, county solicitor, 3,555; Fowler, board of director, 381; Follett, Congressman, first district, 329; Jordan, Congressman, second district, \$1,763. The Republicans claim the election of Bedford for sheriff.

Henry Ward Beecher.
NEW YORK, October 10.—This morning the autumn meeting of the Congressional Association, composed of the Brooklyn and New York churches, met at the Park Congregational Church at Brooklyn. Many well known clergymen were in attendance. Rev. Henry Ward Beecher addressed the association, occupying over two and a half hours, giving his reasons for differing with the churches represented there, in the matter of faith. He closed by announcing his withdrawal from the association. The statement caused much surprise, and speculation was rife in regard to it.

Railroad News.
ATLANTA, GA., October 10.—At a meeting of the Georgia Railroad directors to-day a resolution was passed ordering the stock to be taken of the New York stock exchange. The rental for a half year, \$300,000, was paid promptly by the lessees, the Louisville and Nashville and Central Railroad General Managers resigned from the directory on account of being president of the Central, and State treasurer Spoor was elected to fill the vacancy.
