

Letter from Greenville.

GREENVILLE, TENN., May 8th, 1870. Editors Chronicle: In common with true Republicans in East Tennessee, we of Greenville rejoice that you have succeeded in establishing a first-class Republican Daily in Knoxville.

The Calamity in Richmond--Official Report of the Killed.

OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH, RICHMOND, Va., May 4th, 1870. The following is the mortality report of the victims of the late disaster at the Capitol for the week ending Saturday, April 30, compiled from the sextons' returns received at this office:

Whole number of deaths to that date, 55. Color--white, 52; colored, 3. Condition--Single, 8; married, 32; unknown, 15. Nativity--United States, 39; Ireland, 4; England, 1; Germany, 1; Prussia, 1; Poland, 1; unknown, 6. Age--10 years to 20, 1; 20 years to 30, 7; 30 years to 40, 9; 40 years to 50, 12; 50 years to 60, 5; 60 years to 70, 5; 70 years to 80, 1; unknown, 15.


