STATE NEWS.

The claims of the gun factory at Nashville is being agitated in Nashville. Newton B. Hart, Esq., a well known lawyer, of Memphis, died recently in Alton, Illinois, after a lengthened illness. Mr. Wm. RECORD OF THE TENNESSEE LEGISLATURE.

RECORD OF THE TENNESSEE LEGISLATURE. NUMBER 1. As the time draws near for the re-assembling of the legislative Solons who rule our State, we naturally turn our eyes to their past exploits, and wonder what will be their next one. Probably the world never saw the like of the legislature, which, for six months of the year 1869-70, frisked and cavorted in and around the capital of Tennessee. The working majority of that wise convective had been for several years starting on short commons or honors and profits, away from the public crib. They came back to it with the rush and scamp of a starved herd—each one more greedy than his neighbor, and all gaily and friskily crowding to the trough together. Melancholy as the exhibition was, it had, nevertheless, a comic aspect which is irresistible. Your genuine rebel, likes sometimes to stand upon dignity, but no personal or ancestral dignity is proof against the seductive rattling of the plunder shaking in the public half bushel; and when that long unheard music sounded in their ears, the capering of rebel generals, colonels, majors, captains and lieutenants, (I think that army contained no privates) was something fearful to see. These gentlemen came to Nashville to meet the grave and difficult questions of the time, with but one idea of legislative function and duty, and that was the chief end of a legislature is to repeal things. They charged down upon the statute books, and ran a-muck among the laws of Tennessee in the cheerful spirit of the gay Irishman, whose only rule in a shindy was to hit a head wherever he saw one. The first statute which seems to have attracted the attention of the wise men of Nashville was the Act passed February 17, 1868, and which requires the Governor to designate the newspapers in which legal notices are to be published. No one supposed that the repeal of this Act was a matter of any pressing public necessity, but a crowd of hungry editors were waiting to be fed, and Governor Senter could not now be trusted to select the papers. So, on the 18th of October, 1869, it was enacted, "That an Act passed the 17th day of February, 1868, to regulate the publication of legal notices, be, and the same is hereby repealed, and that this Act take effect from and after its passage." One would suppose that the obnoxious statute was now dead and would disturb the quiet of the rebel Democracy no longer. But no—they owed it a grudge, and if they could not slay the ghost of the deceased statute they could at least bestow a parting kick upon its carcass. So on the 29th of October, 1869, the Legislature passed another statute entitled, "An Act to Restore Justice to the Press of Tennessee," which provides as follows: "That an Act passed February 17th, 1868, entitled 'An Act to regulate the publication of Legal Notices,' be and the same is hereby repealed." There is nothing like doing up work thoroughly when you are about it; and the Legislature having slain their first enemy and scalped him, sounded the war whoop, and was ready for new exploits. The next object of attack was the Jury Law of 1869, which being an uncommon enemy was thought worthy to be slain, scalped, and burned at the stake. The war dance was performed, and thrice they slew the slain." In other words this statute was repealed three times—once on October 27th, 1869, and twice on January 7th, 1870, as appears by Chapters IV, XXXV, and XVII, of the Session Laws of 1869-70, pages 4, 45 and 135. The statute providing for a Board of Commissioners for Madison county was repealed twice, and the last time, to make sure, they repealed all laws providing for such Board of Commissioners in any county. By an act passed November 11th, 1869, it was attempted to relieve Judge Thomas N. Frazer from the effect of the judgment pronounced against him when he was impeached and convicted of official misconduct by a former Legislature; which statute being under the Constitution then existing, of no validity, and the political services of the Judge being too important to be ignored, the Constitutional Convention found it necessary to show up the shaky statute by a declaration in the new Constitution that the Legislature had the power to pass an act of that kind. The next act is one passed November 23rd, 1869, declaring that every act done by Commissioners of Registration in the issuance of certificates be ratified and declared legal, and that all indictments and prosecutions against them for any such acts should be dismissed. As most of the members of that Legislature owed their seats to the rascality of these same Commissioners, the passage of this statute was a measure of common gratitude, while the rule of "honor among thieves," clearly justifies. We cite it merely to show the clearness with which the Legislature recognized both the rascality and the reward that was due to it. I will discuss some future proceedings of this Legislature at another time. THE POOR FARMER.—A poor farmer cannot conceal the fact that he is a poor farmer. Resolved, That some fitting monument should be erected by his countrymen to mark the spot where rest the remains of our beloved commander, and that this society shall take the initiative steps for its erection, and to that end a committee be now appointed to arrange some method to procure the necessary funds, and to provide a design, specification and estimate therefor, and to report at the next meeting. Resolved, That the President shall appoint some committee to prepare a biography of General Thomas, and collate and arrange the proceedings of the various States and associations in honor of his memory, with a view to future publication by this society.
