Opening of Navigation.

The following will give the dates when navigation was opened at this port by the arrival of a vessel from Bay City or from some port south of Saginaw Bay—the record commencing 1871:

In 1871, the steamer Marine City arrived on the 17th day of March, from Detroit.

The propeller Wenona arrived on the 17th of April, 1872, from Detroit.

In 1873, the Wenona was again the first boat, arriving on the 30th of April, from Detroit.

In 1874, the first arrival was the steamer Huron, which reached this port, from Bay City, on the 20th of March.

In 1875, the Propeller Wenona reached Alpena, from Detroit, on the 19th of April.

In 1876, the Wenona was again the first boat, arriving here on the 19th of April.

In 1877, the steamer Dove from Bay City, reached this port on the 21st of April.

In 1878, steamer Music, from Bay City, got to Alpena on the 10th of March.

In 1879, the propeller St. Joseph, from Detroit, reached Alpena on the 5th of April.

In 1880, the propeller T. S. Faxton, from Bay City, arrived here on the 6th of March.

In 1881, the steam barge Rhoda Stewart, from Detroit, arrived here on the 29th of April, and was followed by the Pearl and Westford the same evening.

In 1882, the hooker Imperial arrived from Port Sanilac, March 6th.

In 1883, the steamer Arundell arrived from Bay City at about 5 o'clock A. M., on April 19th, and the steamer Pearl arrived about 5 o'clock P. M., from Detroit.

In 1884, the steamer Florn, from Detroit, arrived about 2 o'clock, April 11th.

Navigation opened at this port for 1885 with the arrival of the mail steamer Arundell at 1 o'clock on the morning of April 26th, from Bay City, and the steamer Atlantic about 5 o'clock in the afternoon, from Detroit.

During the past fifteen years there has been but two years when navigation opened later than it did in 1885—April 29th, 1881, and April 30th, 1873.

Ice in Thunder Bay.

Last Friday morning, April 24th, Thunder Bay was full of ice. An observation taken from top of a two story building, near the Bay, showed a small streak of water on the north side—about ten miles out. On the south side no water could be seen—even when a telescope was used. The wind was blowing fresh from the northwest. By four o'clock in the afternoon, the greater part of the ice outside Sulphur Island had blown out and the shore ice had moved out a mile or so. By six o'clock the only ice in the Bay was in that part between Sulphur Island and the Osineke region, and a strip about half a mile wide which extended across to the north shore of the bay. A large gap had opened to Partridge Point, and the north part of the bay was free from ice up to a considerable way inside of White Fish Point.

Saturday morning the entire north side of the bay was free from ice, and there was no hindrance to prevent vessels from entering the river. The wind was northeast, and considerable ice could be seen drifting towards the southwest side of the bay. No ice could be seen at the north side.

At six o'clock in the morning of the 25th, the steamer Remora started for Oscoda, and the tug Fisherman started for the net grounds to set some gill nets. The Remora took the southerly course and about eight miles out found a strong field of ice in front, which caused her to head northward to go around it.

Sunday night the ice between Sulphur Island and the Osineke region went out, leaving Thunder Bay free from ice.

Board of Education.

Journal of session held April 8th, 1885, read and approved.

From Finance Committee recommending the payment of the following bills:

Trotter Bros & Co., sundries \$11.11; Pioneer Bookbinding Co., work for library \$1.00. Moved by Mr. Dewey that the report be accepted and warrants ordered drawn for

the payment of the several bills as recommended. Carried by vote as follows: Ayes—Dewey, Maltz, Mellen and Racette. Nays—None. Trustees Wagoner and Bruno appeared and took their seats. The special committee appointed at last meeting not being prepared to report, Moved by Trustee Dewey, that we do appropriate such a sum as may be necessary to heat and ventilate the Central Building, such sum not to exceed \$1,000.00. Lost by vote as follows: Ayes—Dewey and Bruno. Nays—Maltz, Mellen, Wagoner and Racette.

To the Hon. the Board of Education of the City of Alpena:—We would most respectfully recommend the following amounts for school purposes for the ensuing year, and that the same be certified to the Common Council.

Teacher's wages \$11,500.00; Janitor's wages 1,500.00; Librarian's wages 100.00; Literary purposes 100.00; Wood and cutting same 800.00; Repairs to school buildings, etc. 800.00; Ground for school building in 2d ward 500.00; New school building 2,000.00; Furnishing school room 400.00. Total \$18,872.22.

Chairman Finance Committee. Dated Alpena, April 22nd, 1885. Moved by Trustee Dewey that the report of the Finance Committee be accepted and adopted and their recommendations concurred in. Carried by vote as follows: Ayes—Dewey, Maltz, Mellen, Wagoner, Bruno and Racette. Nays—None. On motion of Mr. Wagoner the Board adjourned.
