There are stated to have been imported into Great Britain, in 1857, 127,000,000 lbs. of wool; of which 90,000,000 lbs. was retained for home consumption, and the rest exported. The total value of the woolen and worsted yarn exported that year was £13,645,000, and £38,289,000 worth of cotton goods and yarn. In the manufacture of woolen goods, there are about 150,000 operatives engaged, and about 125,000 in the manufacture of worsted goods, while the whole number of persons directly dependent upon the trade in these two kinds of goods, is set down at \$37,500. The wages of the woolen operatives average 12s 6d for each man, woman and child, making for the 150,000 operatives £4,875,000 a year. The annual value of the woolen manufactures of the kingdom is estimated at £20,100,000 or about \$100,000,000 per annum. It would be a matter of interest to know how many of these 275,000 operatives find employment upon goods exported to the United States, and what portion of those \$100,000,000 is paid by American consumers of these British goods. If these facts were ascertained, we should know how many of the thousands of American laborers lying idle would be supported by the policy of manufacturing our own goods instead of hiring England to do it for us.—Det. Adv.

AN Act for the Destruction of Canada Tides.
Section 1. Be it enacted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Cass in Session assembled, that any person owning, occupying, or having the use of any land in the County of Cass, who shall knowingly suffer any Canada Tides to grow to maturity, or so nearly as to be found in the stage of maturity, in the County of Cass, shall forfeit and pay not less than two dollars, nor more than twenty dollars, at the discretion of the Court, with costs of recovery, for every acre of land so found to be in the stage of maturity, in the County of Cass, and shall be appointed among the several School Districts, in the same manner as other school money.
Section 2. Any person residing in said County of Cass may institute a suit for the recovery of said money, in the name of the people of the State of Michigan.
Section 3. All moneys which shall come into the hands of any Justice by the virtue of the foregoing provisions, shall be paid over to the Treasurer as aforesaid, within thirty days from the receipt thereof. Any such Justice, who shall neglect or refuse to pay over said moneys, shall be liable to pay said moneys in double the amount which he would be liable to pay said Treasurer, the same to be recovered before the Grand Jury or Court, and in the case, and applied to the support of Schools in the same manner as is provided in section one of this act.
Section 4. This act shall take effect and be in force in ninety days from and after its passage.
