## JOURNAL OF THE

Board of Supervisors, of Ottawa County, Mich., October, 12, 1863.

The committee on accounts reported sundry accounts, which were allowed, from No. 71 up to 101, inclusive.

Mr. Lillie offered the following resolution which was carried.  
**Resolved**, That the Chairman and Clerk of this Board, be and they are hereby authorized to issue Bonds upon the County to the amount of four thousand dollars.

And the County Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized to negotiate the same at the least possible rates, the money so raised to be placed to the credit of the Volunteer Family Relief Fund and subject to the proper order.

On motion of Mr. Eames, adjourned until to-morrow morning at 8 o'clock.

Thursday, October, 15, A. D. 1863, 8 o'clock A. M.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment, and was called to order by the Chairman. The Roll was called and quorum present.

The proceedings of yesterday were read and approved.  
The Committee on Equalization made a report as follows:

C. L. STORRS, Chairman.

Mr. Howard made a motion that the report be accepted and adopted.

The Committee on accounts reported several accounts which were allowed from 103, to 110, inclusive. On motion of Mr. Storrs the account of the publishers of the GROSSENER for publishing the proceedings of this Board of the January term 1863, at \$47.20 to be credited to the Volunteer Relief Fund, and that the balance of the account \$11.70 for printing the proceedings of the June term 1863 be allowed. Carried. The account of H. G. Smith was rejected.

Mr. Lillie offered the following resolution, to wit:  
**Resolved**, That this Board raise the present pay of Supervisors of one dollar and fifty cents per day, to two dollars and fifty cents per day, for meeting at the County Seat to do county business, the present pay is not sufficient to pay expenses. Which resolution was adopted by the following vote.

Yeas—Blendon, Chester, Jamestown, Olive, Polkton, Spring Lake, Tallmadge, Wright, and Zeeland—9.  
Nays—Allendale, Crockery, Georgetown, and Grand Haven—4.  
Robinson was excused from voting and Holland was absent.

Mr. Lawrence offered the following resolution.  
**Resolved**, That the rate of Ferrriage at the Ferry across Grand River on the road between Grand Haven, Mill Point and Ferrysburg be altered as follows: For each single horse and buggy from twenty cents as heretofore established to fifteen cents and for each double team from twenty five cents, as heretofore established to twenty cents, and at the Ferry across Grand River at Grand Haven, as follows: For one person and baggage from five cents as heretofore established to three cents.

On motion of Mr. Van Hees the resolution was referred to the Committee on roads and bridges.

On motion of Mr. Reed adjourned until one o'clock this afternoon.

Thursday afternoon, one o'clock.

Board met pursuant to adjournment and was called to order by the Chairman.

The Clerk called the Roll, a quorum being present.  
The Committee on roads and bridges reported as follows on the above resolution presented by Mr. Lawrence, to wit:

The Committee on roads and bridges would respectfully report that in their opinion the rates of Ferrriage on the Ferries named in the resolution should not be changed.  
JOEL A. WALTER, Chairman.

On motion of Mr. Howard the report was accepted and adopted.

Mr. Howard moved to re-consider the vote by which it was resolved to remove the County Seat to section 10, Town 7 North Range 14 West.

Which motion was lost by the following vote:  
Yeas—Crockery, Holland, Grand Haven, Olive and Spring Lake—5.  
Nays—Allendale, Blendon, Chester, Georgetown, Jamestown, Polkton, Robinson, Tallmadge, Wright and Zeeland—10.

On motion of Mr. Storrs the following resolution was adopted.  
**Resolved**, That the Clerk of this Board be instructed to make an apportionment to each town of the money appropriated for the Volunteer Relief Fund whereof no orders were drawn according to the reports of the different Supervisors, taking as a basis the report of the Committee of the Volunteer Relief Fund.

On motion of Mr. Lillie the different accounts to the Supervisors were allowed.

On motion of Mr. Eames the proposition of the printers was taken from the table which reads as follows:

Grand Haven, October 12, 1863.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of the County of Ottawa:

The undersigned, publisher of the Grand Haven USTON, hereby proposes to publish the proceedings of your Board at its present, October Sessions, in full, for the compensation of twenty five (25) cents per square, being one half the usual rates, your Board appropriating the other half of what would be due me for such publication at full rates, to the Volunteer Family Relief Fund. I am authorized also by Messrs. J. & J. W. Barnes, of the News to make the same proposition on their behalf.

Respectfully,

Mr. Van Hees made a motion to strike out in the proposition all that relates to the Volunteer Relief Fund; and add to it in its proper place, the newspapers the HOLLANDER and the GROSSENER, provided they will publish the proceedings at the same rate. Which motion was carried.

Whereupon the original proposition as amended was adopted.  
The Committee on Finance reports as follows:

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors:—Your Committee on Finance respectfully report, that they have examined into the financial affairs of the county, and the amounts necessary to be raised to meet the expenses of the county for the ensuing year; and that they find that the available funds now in the hands of the County Treasurer are sufficient to satisfy claims allowed against the County up to the first day of October instant, with the exception of a balance of about six hundred dollars on the amount of orders issued to pay indebtedness to the Towns.

That the total amount necessary to be raised by taxation during the ensuing year, is twenty-two thousand one hundred and forty-nine and 62-100 dollars, as follows:

On motion of Mr. Howard the following resolution was adopted:  
**Resolved**, That, whereas, there was an error in the warrant directed to the Supervisor of the Township of Holland, of \$31,305, for the Taxes of 1862, as appears by said Tax Roll and Warrant. Therefore,

**Resolved**, That the Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to draw an order upon the Treasurer in favor of said Town, upon the account of Taxation amounting to \$399 70 and deliver the same to the Treasurer of said Township.

On motion of Mr. Reed the vote on the report of the Superintendents of the Poor was re-considered, so that it now reads "accepted" instead as before "accepted and adopted."

On motion of Mr. Storrs, the Board adjourned until the second Monday of January, A. D. 1864.
