### Last Year's Cotton Crop Statement.

The New York Financial Chronicle's statement of the cotton crop of last year received this morning makes the total 6,992,234 bales, and 27,423 bales more than the crop report of the National Cotton Exchange. There is an excess of some 18,000 bales in Southern consumption according to Chronicle's report, and 10,000 bales excess in receipts at the ports. The telegrams regarding the National Cotton Exchange's report show some discrepancies, or crooked figuring. The total port receipts of the Exchange is 6,009,612 bales, of overland shipments 641,501, and of Southern consumption 313,383, making the total bales 6,964,896, while the receipts as published by telegrams yesterday show a total of 6,945,756 bales, or about 18,000 less than the above. The Chronicle's—gives Southern consumption at 331,000 bales. Much interest is manifested in both statements, but the National Cotton Exchange is regarded as official and will be the figures accepted as the real crop of 1882-3. Many, however, believe the Chronicle is closest to the mark.

### THE PERILOUS VOYAGE.

At twenty minutes past three p.m., Buffalo time, the boat was towed out into the stream and cut loose at about the point where Captain Webb started on his fatal swim. She went swiftly down the stream, and when reaching the rapids was dashed about like a small boat in a rough sea, but kept her course safely though careening and turning around several times. She reached the whirlpool in about three minutes from the time she struck the rough water. Then she floated around and gradually worked toward the Canadian shore, remaining in the whirlpool about twenty minutes. After reaching the shore she was secured and her flags taken off, after which she was pushed out into the stream and down the river some distance, when she was taken in tow by some boys and tied up at the Lewiston dock.

### SALE OF THE GREELY FARM

Miss Gabrielle Greely Buys it for \$10,000, No One Bidding Against Her.

Special to Commercial Gazette, CHAPPAQUA, N. Y., September 8.—The estate of Chappaqua, of the late Horace Greely, was sold at auction to-day. Miss Gabrielle Greely bought it for \$10,000, half of its estimated value. Joshua Washburn and Jackson Allen, who own farms adjoining the estate, were anxious to purchase the property, but they would not bid against Miss Greely. The young lady is boarding here near the estate, and she attended the sale accompanied in a buggy behind a spirited horse. When Auctioneer Israel Haight opened the sale, she called from her vehicle "Ten thousand dollars," and Mr. Haight tried for half an hour to get an additional bid of even \$10 more. The farm, seventy-seven acres, originally owned by Mr. Greely about the sum it sold for to-day. In improvements he laid out over \$70,000. Half of the purchase money goes to the children of Miss Greely's dead sister, less about one-third that Colonel Smith will receive, his wife having died intestate.
