



The cutting apparatus is in front of the wheels, in full view of the driver, enabling him to see and avoid obstacles, removing the danger to life and limb by being thrown from his seat. The bar can be elevated to any angle from the seat with perfect ease, allowing the mower to be driven close to trees or rocks without throwing out of gear or stopping the team.

The whiffletrees are suspended beneath the tongue, and are attached to the draft chain which passes through a loop on the main shoe to a hook on the shaft supporter near the axle. This reduces the draft, prevents the cutting apparatus from dropping into dead furrows or holes so suddenly as to unseat the driver or jar the machine. It also removes all side draft.




