But few men in the Northern Church have been so talked of in late years as Bishop Haven, on account of his pronounced and repeatedly asserted views on the subject of the colored race.

Many of such reports are circulated, but one thing is quite certain, Bishop Haven is a RADICAL EXTREMIST.

On the subject of our colored "friend and brother," if our memory is not at fault, a delegation from Lloyd Street Church, in this city, requested appointment to Southern Biographic or charge. But whether from excess of love for us, or from some other motive, the Northern Methodist Council of Bishops decreed that the position should rest with the fold of that church in this section.
