Ecclesiastical Court—First Baptist Church.

TRIAL OF REV. J. H. GRAVES.

The Court not pursuant to adjournment on Wednesday evening last, was opened by the Moderator reading the first Psalm and prayer by Rev. Mr. Woodfolk.

The Moderator, before proceeding to business, took occasion to admonish the congregation of the impropriety of making any demonstrations on this occasion.

The reading of the record of last meeting was called for, but the clerks not having their minutes complete, a motion was made to dispense with the reading till next regular meeting night. Motion carried.

The charges brought against Rev. J. H. Graves, having been read, the Moderator called for the proof to sustain them.

Mr. C. A. Fallier, one of the prosecutors in the case took the floor—and read the first charge in the indictment—and proceeded to prove the correctness of the same by reading extracts from the columns of the Tennessee Baptist, which were considered as bringing reproach and injury upon Rev. B. B. C. Howell, pastor of the First Baptist Church, and tried to destroy his character and influence in the Southwest, and the publication of various false and malicious misrepresentations.

The proof in the first charge being admitted, the Mod. rator remarked that it now devolved upon the accused to show that the testimony submitted was incorrect and proved evidence sufficient to vindicate him from the charge.

The accused, Rev. J. H. Graves, being called upon to defend himself, was found to be absent, together with those who participated in the meeting on Tuesday night.

Graves—reviewing the entire history of his course as pastor of the First Baptist Church—in vindication of his course in several attempts, through friends, to effect settlement of the difficulties that have for several months existed between him and the accused.
