THE DEEDS OF DECEIT. It is thought, at Washington, settles without a doubt, the unconstitutionality of the proposed protectorate over the Territory of the United States.

There is certainly no power given by the Constitution, to the Federal Government to establish or maintain colonies bordering on the United States.

And indeed the power exercised by a government there, according to its own charter, is not without great jealousy by the leading states of the day.

It is not meant, however, to question the power of Congress in this respect. The power to expand the territory of the United States, by the admission of new States, is plainly conferred on Congress.

It will be seen that the Supreme Court denies the right of the General Government to hold any territory or Territory outside of the United States.

The Monroe Doctrine.

The "National Intelligencer" of Saturday has a long and elaborate history of the Monroe Doctrine.

1. That the Monroe declaration of 1823, in his own words, is a declaration of the United States in relation to the European States.

2. That the Monroe declaration, in so far as it related to the threatened intervention of a Holy Alliance in the concerns of the Spanish-American States, was intended to meet a particular contingency of events, and therefore to be thrown away with the occasion which it was intended to meet.

3. That the Monroe doctrine, in so far as it related to the colonization of the American continent by any European power, was intended to bind the United States to guard the territory of the New World from such occupation by European States.

4. That the "Monroe doctrine" was not in any sense a declaration of the United States, but a declaration of the Democratic Party.
