ORDINANCE No. 54.
Be it ordained and established by the President and Trustees of the Village of Paw Paw: That it shall not be lawful for any person to deposit any saw log or any thing that may encumber any street within the limits of the village of Paw Paw. And be it further ordained, and established, that all saw logs or other incumbrances at present lying within the limits of any street in the village of Paw Paw, shall be immediately removed by the owner of such saw log, or the person who deposited such encumbrances. Any person violating or refusing or neglecting to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed twenty-five dollars for each and every offence, together with a fine of five dollars for each day such log or other incumbrances shall remain in the streets of the village of Paw Paw after this ordinance takes effect. 
