PROBATE COURT—Hilton, Judge. Jan. 18.—Est. of Mary A. Fuller and Wm. Spooner, deceased; last day of hearing claims—claims heard and allowed and adm'r ordered to pay debts. Est. of Jacob Cruger, deceased; petition for probate of will. Est. of Chas. W. Andrews; petition for adm'r; day of hearing, Feb. 12th, in both cases. Est. of Oliver H. Foote, deceased; first day of hearing claims. Jan. 22.—Est. of Jesse B. Ames, deceased; order entered assigning residue of estate. Est. of Mary A. The following is the opinion of the court: The administrator of this estate files his petition for license to sell for reasons set forth in said petition, but which seems to me to be wholly without force. He does not seek to sell for the payment of debts allowed by this court, but among other things for the satisfaction of certain mortgages upon which sale of the premises has already been had, and the redemption expiring in the course of two months. The claims secured by these mortgage liens have never been proved up as claims against the estate, and I am unable to see what interest there is for sale by virtue of such license, should one be granted, unless the administrator should redeem therefrom. It would be a mere juggle ceremony, encumber the estate needlessly, and only make additional costs to be borne individually by the administrator, while the purchaser could take no possible title.
