### The Supervisors.

The probate judge reported ten indigent insane persons committed to the asylum since Jan. 1st, 1888.

The county treasurer reported the total receipts of the county for the fiscal year ending Sept. 30th to have been \$86,896.58; expenditures during year, \$86,690.32; estimated liabilities for ensuing year, \$26,467.88; estimated surplus, \$43,738.70.

Willis W. Hodge was re-elected as a member of the board of county superintendents of the poor.

The salary of prosecuting attorney was fixed at \$1,000 per annum, a reduction of \$200; the salary of the county treasurer was fixed at a like sum, an increase of \$200; the salary of the county clerk was fixed at the sum of \$700, no change.

Warren H. Goss of Bangor, was elected county drain commissioner.

The committee on footing rolls reported the assessed valuation of the county to be \$13,193,066.

The superintendents of poor reported expense of poor house and farm as \$4,004.16; receipts from same, \$365.90; amount of temporary relief, \$7,391.92; total net expense of maintaining county poor, \$11,030.18.

The whole number of paupers at the county house was sixty; the average number was thirty-three and one-third.

The report of the equalization committee was adopted, making the basis of equalization \$12,000,000, the same as heretofore. The townships were valued the same as last year, with the following exceptions: Antwerp increased \$5,000, Columbia decreased \$10,000, Covert decreased \$5,000, Hartford increased \$50,000, Lawrence decreased \$10,000, Paw Paw decreased \$10,000, Porter decreased \$5,000, Pine Grove decreased \$15,000, South Haven increased \$10,000, Waverly decreased \$10,000.
