**Obituary.**  
 The subject of this sketch, Nancy Glasgow Hipp, was born in Jefferson, Cass county, Mich., July 18, 1842, and departed this life May 2, 1903, at her home in Alma, Van Buren county, in the triumphs of the christian faith. At the early age of 17 she was united in marriage to H. B. Sharp. By the early death of Mr. Sharp she was soon left a widow with one child. Six years later she was married to Jerome L. Enos. Four children, all girls, were born of this union. Mr. Enos died in May, 1879, and in March, 1889, she was married to E. W. Hipp of Alma. Her five children survive her and are all grown to womanhood. They are Mrs. L. L. Freer of Vandalia, Mrs. C. F. Weed of Chicago, Ill., Mrs. S. C. Marshall of Cassopolis, Mrs. R. H. Davis of Edwardsburg, Mrs. D. A. Hoodemaker of Alma. She also leaves 11 grandchildren, one brother, D. A. Glasgow of Osceola, Ind., two sisters, Mrs. A. Saulsbury of Constantine, Mich., and Mrs. O. Walker of Port Huron, Mich., and other relatives.

At the age of 16 she was converted and united with the Baptist church, of which denomination she was a faithful member until her last marriage, when she withdrew and united with the M. E. church at Alma, continuing in its membership until the close of life. As a christian she was faithful, consistent and exemplary. She was a loving mother, a faithful and devoted wife and a useful member of society. Naturally of a pleasing and social disposition she made friends of all with whom she came in contact. She will be much missed in the societies of the church and in the community where she lived.

A large delegation of the order of Patricians, of which society she was a member, was present at the funeral. It was a beautiful and touching incident as the members of this society passed by to take their last look at the silent form, each leaving his or her little bouquet of flowers on the casket, a loving tribute to the memory of a departed friend and sister. Besides the relatives already mentioned a large circle of friends both at Alma and Cassopolis will miss her and mourn her death.

The funeral services were held Sunday at the home and were conducted by Rev. Arba Martin of the Mattawan charge. The remains were taken to Cassopolis, Monday, where the friends were joined by Mrs. C. F. Weed and husband and D. A. Glasgow. Rev. O. P. Miller read the scripture and offered prayer. She was laid to rest in the Reames and Norton cemetery.
