

C. D. LAWTON ENDORSED

For a Second Nomination as Regent of the University.

Van Buren Republicans also Demand in a Positive Way the Representation to Which Our Vote Entitles Us in the Coming Judicial Convention.

In spite of the zero weather, a large representation of republicans turned out to the county convention at Hartford, Tuesday.

In the absence of County Chairman John Mutchler, who is sick at his home in Bangor, Secretary L. J. Lewis called the convention to order and named M. O. Rowland of Paw Paw as temporary chairman of the convention. E. A. Hartman of South Haven was chosen temporary secretary. Committees were appointed on credentials, permanent organization and order of business, and resolutions. A recess of 10 minutes was taken for the committees to prepare their reports. The committee on credentials then reported all townships represented except Hamilton, Waverly and Almena, and the Hamilton delegation arrived and were accorded their seats a few minutes later. The temporary organization was made permanent.

Van Riper, Hartford; Chas. Shafer, Antwerp; F. M. Young, Decatur; Gilbert Hudson, Bloomingdale; Henry Nower, Lawrence; Jay Gibson, Geneva; E. B. Abbott, Columbia; E. W. Whalin, Pine Grove; Wm. Chapman, Arlington; O. Letson, Covert; Thos. Hare, Keeler; John Marshall, Porter.

RESOLUTIONS.

The committee on resolutions made the following report which, after some discussion, was unanimously adopted: "In accordance with the time honored custom of the republican party in this state, to accord the incumbent of any office serving faithfully his first term, a second nomination if he so desires, we insist that no exception be made to this rule in the case of Hon. Chas. D. Lawton, now holding the office of a regent of the university, but that he be made his own successor; and to this end the delegation from this county to the convention which is to meet at Grand Rapids on the 14th instant is hereby requested to use all honorable endeavor in his behalf.

"Whereas, at the last judicial convention for the 30th judicial circuit, there was no judicial committee to call a convention, the circuit having just been formed; and

"Whereas, Cass county refused to consent to call a convention without according to it an equal representation, which was consented to under the stress of the circumstances then existing; and

"Whereas, the persons consenting to such equal representation were not delegated or authorized to bind the republicans of Van Buren county to such an agreement for the future; and

"Whereas, the same is inequitable and unjust and is in violation of the principle of majority rule which has been the cardinal principle of the republican party through its entire history; therefore,

"Resolved, that the republican party of Van Buren county, in convention assembled, does hereby declare the call for equal representation between the two counties in the judicial convention to be held on the 23d instant at Lawton to nominate a candidate for circuit judge to be unauthorized and unjust, and instructs the delegation this day chosen to attend said convention to refuse to be bound by the apportionment in said call, and to insist that the convention so called be composed of the number of delegates from each county accorded by the republican state central committee, based on the principle of majority rule,

After the adoption of the report, Mr. Lawton was called out, and briefly thanked the convention for its resolution endorsing his candidacy for renomination as regent, and promised his best efforts for the interest of the University if he is renominated and re-elected.

The convention then adjourned, having been in session but little more than an hour.
