

Fewer Eggs are required with ROYAL BAKING POWDER

Chocolate Sponge Roll

- 1 1/4 cups flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 squares melted chocolate
- 2 tablespoons melted shortening
- 3/4 cup hot water
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 1/2 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder

The old method called for 4 eggs and no baking powder

DIRECTIONS—Sift flour, baking powder and salt together three times. Beat whole eggs. Add slowly sugar, then boiling water slowly, add next vanilla, melted chocolate and melted shortening, without beating. Sift in dry ingredients, and fold in as lightly as possible. Pour into large baking pan lined with oiled paper, and bake in slow oven twenty minutes. When done, turn out on a damp, hot cloth, spread with warm icing and roll.
