The Joint High Commission Treaty.

The High Commission which has been

in session for some weeks past, in Wash-

ington, to settle the Alabama claims, and

other questions in dispute between Great

Britain and Yankeeedom, has concluded

its labors. The treaty was signed last

Monday, by the Commissioners, at the

department of state, and the various signers

of the document, exchanged congratula-

tions on the result of their labors, ex-

pressing the belief that they had done

the most they possibly could for the peace

and honor of the countries. Although the

commissioners have been cautious in

talking to persons outside their own circle,

the following will be found to be the

substance of the provisions of the treaty:

First. There are to be two boards of

arbitration, one for Alabama, and one to

be referred to the Alabama, and other

claims, which are recognized as

of responsibility for such depredations

where the government has not exercised

the utmost diligence and possible care

to prevent privateers being fitted out

in its ports to prey upon the commerce
