FARM AND HOUSE.

WALKS AND TALKS IN HOLT COUNTY.

WRITTEN EXPRESSLY FOR THE SENTINEL. BY O. N. POOTE.

WALK NUMBER EIGHT.

Visiting the farm of Mr. Cummins, just north of Oregon, I happened to be just in time for sheep-shearing. Mr. Cummins and his son-in-law, Mr. Fulton, own in the neighborhood of 70 Merinos, from the celebrated Atwood flock of Vermont.

Mr. Fulton understands shearing and putting up wool. He uses a table for trying his fleece by which it is made into a compact roll about 10 inches in length, with the inside of the fleece brought to the outer surface, so that it shows a clean white surface, free from speck or stain, while it is so compressed as to be brought into a bulk that makes it much easier handled than when put up in the usual slip-shod way.

Mr. F. had washed his sheep ten days previous to the shearing, and turned them on blue grass pasture. The time of shearing, in fair weather, he thinks should be seven days after washing, or just sufficient time to allow a flow of oil.

He ships his wool to an Ohio market. He has no doubt of the remunerative character of the Merino in this country, and believes them to be fully as healthy as the coarse woolled sheep.

I found Mr. Cummins to be the possessor of a fine farm of 233 acres of good arable land, and that agriculture was systematically conducted under his supervision.
