GRAHAM BISCUITS.—To a quart of graham flour add sufficient milk, sweet cream to make a stiff dough, beat until light, and bake in a moderately hot oven.

HYGIENIC GERMOLE CAKES.—Three cups purified middlings, one cup graham flour, one egg, one teaspoonful salt, a little salt. Mix with sour milk. Use a hot griddle and serve immediately.

COCONUT DROPS.—Beat the whites of two eggs stiff with four ounces of sugar, then stir in four ounces of desiccated coconut. If the fresh is used, it must be grated, and the water squeezed out. Add a third of a cup of the cracked crumbs; mold the mixture into small pointed cones, and bake until a light brown on the top and bottom.

STALE BREAD.—A nice way to use stale bread is to fry it, simply dipping it in cold water before putting it in the buttered frying pan. It will brown nicely, and is liked by many as well as if dipped in beaten eggs. The latter makes a nice change in the bit of fare. Often make a cold, short-cake and spread with stewed apple sauce, cranberry sauce or some kind of canned fruit. Serve with sauce or sweetened cream.

TO CLEAN BLACK MATERIALS.—Take the article you wish to clean, on the side you intend to make up as the right side; brush well all the dust out of it, then take a piece of black flannel or an old black woollen shawl, and brush with it; dip it into cold coffee, and sponge well the material all over alike; then fold up each piece or breadth in the folds, and iron for three or four hours. Iron on the wrong side, and the old dusty, shabby dress will look just as fresh and bright as when new.
