SCIENTIFIC MISCELLANY.

According to Prof. G. F. Yoo of Kings College, London, a resort to transfusion of blood has saved life in more than half of the recorded cases in which the treatment has been tried.

Analysis by M. E. Rorer indicates that the fungus used by the ancients contained neither lead nor zinc, but were alloys of copper and tin, with small quantities of nickel, iron, phosphorus and occasionally cobalt.

Microscopic vision has separated ruled lines as fine as 113,600 to the inch, but, according to Prof. Rogers, the evidence that finer lines than that have been resolved under the microscope is not conclusive.

A French physician, M. Laveran, believes he has discovered the cause of malarial diseases in a very minute organism. These microbes resemble necklaces of black beads in appearance and are located in the red blood-corpuscles of malarial patients.

By thrusting the ends of green scrub wood—"mallee scrub"—in the fire and catching in a bark trough the sap driven out at the other end, an Australian supplied himself with water and saved his life while crossing a waterless region.

Prof. Proctor says: "I do not insist on the sun's being inhabited when cool enough. Without a special warmer and light-giver he might not be a very comfortable world. Perhaps there might be inherent warmth enough for all practical purposes, and a proper amount of light might shine from his interior, through suitable apertures, on large masses of floating cloud."

M. Regnard has been utilizing dried blood from slaughter-houses for the rearing of lambs. He made experiments on six lambs deserted by the ewes. Three were fed with the usual diet of best-root, hay, etc., and to three the dried and powdered blood was given with the other food.

The flesh of different animals has been analyzed by Prof. C. Vierchow to determine the amounts of water and extract contained therein, as it was thought that the relative value of meats might be thus shown. The differences, however, are found to be too slight to be of any importance.

Prof. Germain Séé has called the attention of the Paris Academy of Medicine to a new medicinal alkaloid said to resemble digitalis in its action but having none of the objectionable properties of that drug. The new substance is called convallarine, and is obtained from the lily of the valley.

Herr Fuchs is inclined to divide the animals of the sea into fauna of light and fauna of darkness, the former being found a little below a depth of thirty fathoms, and the first specimens of the latter type appearing at about fifty fathoms below the surface.
