Fourth Week of the November Term.—Record of the Proceedings. Only two days' session of District Court have been held this week, on Monday and Tuesday.

State vs. Hiram Stewart, inflicting a wound less than mayhem, accused waived trial by jury, and after hearing the evidence the Court adjudged him guilty; sentence—six months imprisonment at hard labor, \$1 50 fine and costs.

SEVERELY BURNED.—An unfortunate and well high fatal accident occurred at the sugar-house of Messrs. McCall Bros.' 27th Hill plantation, Friday morning, the 27th inst. Just about daylight the second engine maker, Mr. P. Goussing, entered the hot room and discovered that a gasoline lamp hanging on a post had sprung a leak and that the escaping oil was in a blaze. He ran to take the lamp down, but it exploded, covering him with burning oil. By the time the flames were extinguished the unfortunate young man was so severely injured that it was feared he would die. His hair is all burned off, and his hands, head, face and breast are badly seared. While it is not now apprehended that his injuries will prove fatal, it is feared he may lose the use of his right arm.

DETECTIVE LEVEE.—An inspection of the levee on the right bank of the river above Bayou Lafourche and along both banks of the latter stream in this parish, has been made by Capt. Darton, who reports that general condition good, but finds three or four points requiring attention. In front of Mr. Adolard Landry's place and of the property of the Misses Cundess the section of the water has caused considerable abrasion of the embankment and a new levee some 1500 feet long will be required there on no distant day. A new piece of levee is required at once on the right bank of the Lafourche, extending from the angle in the old levee just above the railroad bridge to a similar angle below the Iley residence. As the State funds for this district are exhausted the work will have to be done by the parochial authorities. A sink in the bank of the bayou in front of Capt. Nolan's place may necessitate considerable repair to the levee there. We understand that several cuts for roadways, made by parties who were doubtless ignorant of the fact that they were breaking the law as well as the levees, will be reported to the Police Jury.
