DISTRICT COURT IN ST. JAMES. Synopsis of the Business Transacted Last Week.

The following summary of the business transacted during last week's sittings of the District Court for St. James parish, is condensed from the report published in the Creole Herald of the 6th inst.

Mr. N. P. Hymel was selected by Judge Dufel to act as Foreman of the Grand Jury and the following were drawn by lot from the venire for the first week to serve as the remaining members of that body: Joseph Bezel, Melford Webe, Clement Mire, E. J. Perout, Adam Sylvester, Loviney Bourgeois, Philippe Claudet, Douradou Guidry, Joseph Waguespack, Louis Richard, Francois Guiseiph, Henry Woodfork, Paul Garrison, Ovide Bourgeois.

Trials, convicted and sentenced—Chas. Level, horse stealing, one year in the penitentiary; Briton James, assault and battery, placed guilty, \$5 fine or five days in jail; Camille Melancon, assault and battery, five days in jail; Thomas Tombe, shooting at a house, remanded for sentence.

Trials, acquitted—Henry Mitchell, carrying concealed weapon, Willy LeRay, wounding less than mayhem. The latter was ordered by the court to be held until properly transferred to Assension, where a charge of petit larceny is pending against him.


