Items of Interest Cited From the Louisiana Press.

Contract for State Printing Awarded--Fire

at Hackley--Big Corporations Or-

ganized at Franklin--Night

Riders at Eros.

Mike Donahue, a section hand, was

posteriorly assassinated at Boutte.

Incendiaries destroyed a cotton gin

near Taylorsville.

The third annual Webster parish

fair opened at Minden.

Three defendants at Tallulah pleaded

guilty to violating the concubinage

law.

The West Carroll Telephone Com-

pany was formed at Delhi to operate

in five towns.

L. J. Ricard was elected city treas-

urer of Baton Rouge to succeed L. J.

Amis, resigned.

United States government boll

weevil experts addressed a farmers'

meeting at Winnsboro.

Lamar Norwood was shot and killed

at Zachary by A. N. Barksdale as the

result of a planters' feud.

C. E. Woolen, under arrest on a

charge of embezzlement, eluded an of-

ficer at Monroe and escaped.

The printing contract for the Louis-

iana state treasurer's office has been

awarded to Ramires & Jones, of Baton

Rouge.

A new military organization at La-

fayette, known as Company G, First

Infantry, was mustered into service

last week.

Night riders have made their ap-

pearance in the neighborhood of Eros

and demand that all gins in that sec-

tion close down.

The annual reunion of the Louisi-

ana divisions, United Confederate Vet-

erans and Sons of Veterans, was held

at Monroe last week.

A new oil company, with a capital

of \$25,000, was organized at New Iberia

for the purpose of operating in the

Anse-la-Butte field.

The mercantile establishment of J.

I. Warren, of Hackley, was com-

pletely destroyed by fire, causing a

loss estimated at \$15,000.

Cotton gin owners within a radius

of ten miles of Weis, Livingston par-

ish, have hoisted the mandate of night

riders and closed down their gins.

The police jury of Acadia parish

passed an ordinance limiting the

amount of game that may be taken

out of the parish to one bird a day

for one person.

Because she and her husband were

of different religious beliefs and could

not agree on what church to attend,

Mrs. E. Medlock committed suicide at

her home in Shreveport.

Two new corporations, the Mutual

Sugar Company, capitalized at \$80,-

000, and the L. P. Patout Company,

Ltd., with a capital of \$100,000, have

been organized at Franklin.

Eugene H. Hamilton, a United States

government church census representa-

tive, was fined \$300 for using a frank

to transfer his overcoat on the rail-

road from Vicksburg to Shreveport.
