Be it resolved by the police jury of the parish of Ascension, state of Louisiana, that the written consent of Galley & Clark, contractors, on file in this office, to the sale of the series of bonds of the First Road District of the parish of Ascension, of \$35,000, as above described, hereto, to the Calcasieu Trust & Savings Bank, of Lake Charles, La., be and the same is hereby approved and accepted.

Be it further resolved, etc., that the offer of the Calcasieu Trust & Savings Bank, of Lake Charles, La., to purchase the bond issue of the said First Road District of the parish of Ascension, of \$35,000, as above described, for cash at par and accrued interest, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Be it further resolved, etc., that the president and secretary of the police jury of this parish be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sign the signature certificate for the sale of said bonds to the said Calcasieu Trust & Savings Bank, of Lake Charles, La., at par and accrued interest.

**CHARTER**  
—of—  
**KELLER CONTRACTING CO.**

United States of America—State of Louisiana—Parish of Ascension.

**BE IT KNOWN**, that on this 10th day of July, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, before me, CALBEC W. B. EIK, a notary public, duly commissioned, sworn and qualified, within and for the parish of Ascension, state of Louisiana, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the persons, all of the age of majority who have subscribed their names hereto, who declared that, availing themselves of the provisions of the laws of the state of Louisiana relative to the organization and formation of corporations, they do hereby form a corporation for themselves and those persons who may hereafter join with them from this date; they shall have power to contract, sue and be sued in their corporate name; to make and use a corporate seal; to hold, receive, purchase and convey under their corporate name property, both real and personal; to name and appoint managers, directors, officers and agents as their interest and convenience may require and to dismiss them at pleasure; to make and establish such by-laws for the proper management and regulation of the affairs of the corporation as may be necessary and proper.

**ARTICLE I.**  
The name of this corporation shall be KELLER CONTRACTING COMPANY, and the domicile of said corporation shall be in the city of Donaldsonville, parish of Ascension, state of Louisiana, and all citations and other legal process shall be served upon the president of the corporation, and in the event of his absence upon the vice president.

**ARTICLE II.**  
The objects and purposes for which this corporation is organized, and the nature of the business to be carried on by it at its domicile or elsewhere, are hereby declared to be: To engage in the general contracting business for the purpose of constructing levees, highways, railway embankments; to undertake dredging contracts, earth work of all kinds, and generally to do and perform all kinds of contracting work either by machinery, or otherwise; to engage in the planting business for the raising and cultivation of crops of sugar, rice, corn and other produce, and to this end to purchase, lease and rent real estate, and to generally carry on all business connected therewith, and generally to do and perform all things as are necessary and incidental to the purposes for which this corporation is organized.

**ARTICLE III.**  
The capital stock of this corporation shall be the sum of TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$25,000) DOLLARS, divided into two hundred and fifty (250) shares of the par value of one hundred (\$100) dollars, which shall be paid for in money, property or services rendered said corporation, and said corporation shall begin business as soon as ten thousand (\$10,000) dollars of said shares of stock have been subscribed and paid for.

**ARTICLE IV.**  
This corporation shall be managed and controlled by a board of directors consisting of three stockholders, two of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of all business. Said board shall at the first meeting of the stockholders of this corporation, which said meeting shall be held on the 15th day of July, 1914, and annually thereafter on the second Saturday of July, be elected. Failure to elect said officers or directors shall not cause a forfeiture of this charter, but the directors then in office shall serve until their successors shall be elected. Said board at its first meeting shall elect from their number a president, vice presi-

office of president and treasurer may be held by one person. Each share of stock shall be entitled to one vote, either in person or by proxy.

**ARTICLE V.**  
Any article of this corporation may be amended or said corporation may be dissolved by a majority of the stockholders present at a meeting held for said purpose, after ten days notice of which has been given by letter directed and mailed to each stockholder at his last known address.

**ARTICLE VI.**  
No stockholder shall ever be held liable or responsible for the contracts or debts of this corporation in any further sum than the unpaid balance due the corporation on the shares owned by him, nor shall any mere informality in organization have the effect of rendering this charter null or exposing a stockholder to any liability beyond the amount of his unpaid stock.

At the termination of this corporation its affairs shall be liquidated by the board of directors.

The subscribers hereto have set out opposite their names the amount of shares subscribed by them, and this charter shall serve as the original subscription list.

This done and passed, at my office in the city of Donaldsonville, parish of Ascension, state of Louisiana, on the day, month and year first above written, in the presence of Messrs. C. V.
