## PROCLAMATION OF ELECTION.

**SMOKE BEND DRAINAGE DISTRICT.**  
 Donaldsonville, La., May 31, 1919.  
 PURSUANT to a resolution adopted by the board of commissioners of the Smoke Bend Drainage District of the parish of Ascension, state of Louisiana, at a special meeting held at the court house of said district on May 31, 1919, Felix Acosta, president of the board of commissioners of the parish of Ascension, state of Louisiana, in virtue of the authority vested in me and in obedience and compliance with said resolution, do hereby proclaim that a special election be held of the taxpayers qualified under the constitution and laws of the state of Louisiana, to vote at said election, in the Smoke Bend Drainage District of the parish of Ascension, Louisiana, on


**TUESDAY, JULY 1, 1919,**  
 between the hours of 7 o'clock a. m. and 5 o'clock p. m., for the purpose of obtaining the sense of the property taxpayers entitled to vote on the following proposition:  
 To authorize the board of commissioners of the Smoke Bend Drainage District of the parish of Ascension, to create an additional indebtedness of seven thousand dollars (\$7,000), in excess of the one now outstanding, and issue negotiable bonds therefor, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and to run for a period not longer than twenty years, for the following purposes, to-wit: Of operating drainage canals, ditches, or machinery owned and operated or controlled by said drainage district; to open, enlarge, cut, extend such canals and streams situated within the limits of said drainage district as in the judgment of said board of commissioners of said drainage district may be deemed necessary and proper, economically to drain the property included within the limits thereof.  
 For the purposes of said election, and in accordance with said ordinance, the polling place is hereby designated, at the Honorable Charles H. Brantley, situated within the limits of said district, and Messrs. J. Acosta, S. P. Brantley and Morris Oube have been appointed commissioners, and Arthur Veum as clerk to serve as said poll. All of said commissioners and clerk of election shall serve without compensation.  
 I do further proclaim and give notice that at 5 o'clock p. m. on Thursday, July 3, 1919, the said board of commissioners of the Smoke Bend Drainage District of the parish of Ascension, Louisiana, will meet at Smoke Bend, the court house of said district, and in open session proceed to open ballot boxes, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass returns, and declare the result of the special election, which result they shall thereafter promulgate by publication in one issue of the official journal of the parish of Ascension.

## CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATIONS.

Opportunities to Qualify for Federal Government Positions.

The United States Civil Service Commission announces that examinations will be held in New Orleans on the dates stated for filling the following local positions in that city: Inspector of oil, \$1600-\$1800, zone supply office, June 23; master ship-fitter, \$9.92 per diem, naval station, July 8; stenographer and typewriter, June 17.

Examinations for other positions are announced as follows: Every Tuesday, bookkeeper and stenographer and typewriter, for employment at Washington, D. C.; July 9, clerk qualified as storeroom supervisor, coal yard foreman, and storekeeper; July 9 and Sept. 3, trained nurse, Panama Canal service; July 9 and Aug. 6, correspondence clerk; July 9 and Sept. 3 and 4, local and assistant inspector of boilers; July 9, Aug. 6, Sept. 3, and Oct. 8, apprentice fish culturist, coder, graphotype operator, addressograph operator, mimeograph operator, proof reader, and physical laboratory helper; July 19, clerk, male only, for employment at Washington; July 23, Aug. 20, and Sept. 17, law clerk and typist, veterinarian, and lay (meat) inspector.

# INCREASE NUMBER OF "Y" WORKERS

Five Months After Armistice Signed Welfare Body Has 9,350 "Over There."

Five months after the signing of the armistice the Young Men's Christian association had 9,350 workers overseas, according to an official statement issued by the national war figure council of the association. The work shows an increase of 726 workers since last November, indicating that the Y. M. C. A. has strengthened its forces, despite the return of troops to America, to meet the greater need for its work that came with the end of the fighting.

Of the total number, 5,528 are men, a small portion of whom are directing the "Y" overseas work from the Paris headquarters, while the great majority are scattered from Archangel to Rome, and from Vladivostok to Brest and London and the north of Scotland. There are 2,187 women workers abroad. Most of these are helping to give pleasure to the men who go to the Y. M. C. A. leave areas, on the Riviera, at Aix les Bains, at Gouterets in the Hautes Pyrenees, and elsewhere. More than 40 are assisting in the metropolitan entertainment of the troops.

In the overseas entertainment bureau of the war work council there are 635 men and women workers abroad. Of these, 352 were recruited by the Overseas Theater League workers—125 men and 227 women. The remainder, 283, were enlisted by the "Y" entertainment section.

Since the beginning of its overseas work, the Y. M. C. A. has sent 11,229 men and women abroad—8,338 men and 2,891 women. Of these, 2,645 men and 234 women have returned, eleven were killed in action, three died of wounds and 56 from disease and other causes.
