WAR RISK INSURANCE.

Provisions For Re-instatement Are Liberalized.

A series of decisions issued by the director of the Bureau of War Risk Insurance with the approval of the secretary of the treasury provides more liberal conditions for reinstatement of lapsed or canceled insurance.

The provisions of Treasury Decision No. 47, allowing eighteen months from the date of discharge for reinstatement upon payment of only two months' premiums on the amount of insurance to be reinstated, are retained. That decision is liberalized, however, by a new provision that men out of the service are permitted to reinstate by merely paying the two months' premiums without making a statement as to health at any time within three calendar months following the month of discharge.

After three months following the date of discharge have elapsed, a statement from the applicant to the effect that he is in as good health as at the date of discharge or at the expiration of the grace period, whichever is the later date, will be required together with a written application for reinstatement and the tender of two months' premiums on the amount of insurance he wishes to reinstate.

In order to give all former service men whose insurance has lapsed or been canceled, a fair chance to reinstate their insurance, including men who have been cut of the service eighteen months or more, and who are therefore barred from reinstatement under the former ruling, a special blanket ruling is made which allows all ex-service men to reinstate their insurance before December 31, 1919, provided that each applicant is in as good health as at date of





discharge or at expiration of the grace period, whichever is the later date, and so states in his application Of course it is necessary that he tender the two months' premiums on the amount of insurance he wishes to reinstate.

Service men who reinstated their insurance by payment of all back premiums prior to July 25, 1919, when the decision requiring payment of only two months' premiums went into effect, upon written application to the bureau may have any premiums paid in excess of two applied toward the payment of future premiums. For example, if after a policy had lapsed for six months, a man reinstated and paid six months' premiums instead of two, he may secure credit for four months' premiums.

The provisions for reinstatement do not protect a man until he actually reinstates. If he waits he may not be in as good health as he was at the time of discharge and consequently may not be able to secure reinstatement.

Invents New Flying Boat.


Dr. Alexander Graham Bell, the great inventor, has recently perfected a flying boat capable of making a speed of 71 miles per hour. The boat is equipped with two 400-h. p. Liberty motors. It is provided with blades forward and aft and on each side under the wings. As the boat gains speed, the action of the water raises it so that when traveling at 60 miles per hour it is practically out of the water. In other words, the boat, at top speed is traveling on the top set of blades and the body of the boat is 10 feet above water.

This Beautiful Musical Comedy to Be Shown at Plaquemine.

John Cort's "Flo-Flo," that fascinating musical play by Fred de Gressac and Silvio Hein, booked to appear at Theatre Wilbert, Plaquemine, for one night only, Saturday, Dec. 6, tells the story of a small town boy and girl, who, despite many seemingly unsurmountable obstacles, eventually find happiness. The scene opens in the smart Fifth Avenue shop of Robert Simpson and Isidor Moser, where the newest things in trousseaux are being displayed for Angelina's benefit. To this same shop comes Billy Cope, likewise from Oshkosh, who has been Angelina's sweetheart back in the boy and girl days. Although Billy is really a wealthy young person, this knowledge has been kept from him by a wise father who wishes him to start at the bottom and rise by his own efforts. Flo-Flo, a chorus girl, temporarily lending her efforts and charms to the display of corsets in the window of this shop, learns of Billy's inheritance and sets her cap for him. Billy, on being discouraged by Angelina's mother to remain true to her, being a very human young man, is attracted by Flo-Flo's very evident advances and charms. Angelina, who meanwhile has been wavering between love—meaning Billy—and duty—meaning the count, happens to catch Billy kissing Flo-Flo and decides in favor of the count.

The scene then shifts to Angelina's beautiful Long Island home, temporarily, where the wedding rehearsal is in progress. The count who has been pursued here by a Spanish dancer and a former sweetheart, is proved to be only a bogus count after all. Then Flo-Flo, suffering a change of heart, removes the last obstacle to Angelina's and Billy's marriage by disclosing the fact that Billy is really a favored son of a wealthy father, and true to the traditions of musical comedy, they all live happily ever after.

The whole story is planned cleverly to give sufficient excuse for the display of the latest models in beautiful gowns and dainty lingerie, and "Flo-Flo" might rightly be termed "a fashion show set to music."

May Ignore United States.

Recent advices from across the seas indicate that the four Entente powers which have ratified the peace treaty, namely: England, France, Italy and Belgium, "may proceed to organize the League of Nations immediately upon the publication of the peace treaty, now set for about Dec. 1, and that the smaller nations which have ratified the agreement will be called upon to help set up the league as a "going concern." A clause of the league covenant provides that the first meeting shall be called by the president of the United States; but inasmuch as the senate has failed to ratify the treaty, it has been suggested that Mr. Wilson might perform this function as a matter of courtesy.

The failure of the United States to ratify the treaty and League of Nations has very much depressed the statesmen of Europe, who recognize however that steps to give effect to these agreements cannot be longer delayed.


