To Harness Easily.

It is a device to be used on single harness, doing away entirely with traces and also with the straps and straps over the shafts. It is a spring attachment and connected by a leather cord coming back over the dash board. The device can be loosened in a second in case of accident, and the horse freed from the buggy. The automatic harness appliance is sold here by J. A. Puckett & Co., and the company claims a great many advantages for the device.
