

Roads Proposed Under Bond Issue Plan

In Case Bond Issue Carries Each Magisterial District Will Be Well Provided For

Clear Fork

VIRGINIA: At a Circuit Court for Tazewell County continued from last Saturday and held at the Court House thereof on Monday, February 27th, 1911.

Honorable Fulton Kegley, Judge, presiding.

In the matter of the petition of the Board of Supervisors and Freeholders of Clear Fork Magisterial District of Tazewell County, Virginia, petitioning for an election to be called in said district and in said county, to determine the question of Bond Issue for the Macadamizing and otherwise permanently improving the roads of said district:

This day came the petitioners, a majority of the Board of Supervisors of Tazewell County, and fifty freeholders of the Clear Fork magisterial district and presented their petition to this Court, praying an election in the Clear Fork magisterial district of Tazewell County, and in Tazewell County, to determine whether or not the Board of Supervisors of said County of Tazewell shall issue bonds of said County of Tazewell for the purpose of macadamizing or otherwise permanently improving the public roads and bridges of the said Clear Fork magisterial district of said county; and, it appearing to the Court that said petition is signed by a majority of the Board of Supervisors of Tazewell County and by at least fifty freeholders of the Clear Fork magisterial district of said County, and that said petition is in proper form; that the approximate location, length and width of the roads of said district proposed to be macadamized, built, or permanently improved are set out in said petition, and that all of the requirements of the law have been complied with, IT IS ORDERED that the regular judges of election for Tazewell County on Tuesday the 18th day of April, 1911, (which time is more than 30 days from the entering of this order), shall open a poll at the respective voting precincts of said County and take the sense of the qualified voters of the County and of said district, on the question whether the Board of Supervisors shall issue bonds of said County for the macadamizing, building or otherwise permanently improving the public roads of said Clear Fork magisterial district of said County, the approximate location and width of such roads as are proposed to be macadamized or otherwise permanently improved being as follows:

ROADS IN SAID DISTRICT TO BE MACADAMIZED.

1—From the town of Pocahontas in said district in said County, beginning at the west end of Water Street in said town, up Laurel Creek to Bossevain, a distance of about 3 miles, said road to be macadamized to the width of 12 feet.

2—From the present macadam road, near the residence of T. R. Smoot, near Tip Top, Virginia, on the headwaters of Clinch River, by way of Tip Top and Abb's Valley (except about 4 miles across Stony Ridge and Valley Ridge), by Mrs. Mollie Harrison's, and down Abb's Valley to a point about opposite to Bossevain, thence across Laurel Ridge to Bossevain, a distance of about 8 miles of macadam road, to be macadamized 10 feet wide.

3—From Jeffersonville magisterial district line at the farm of J. S. and A. P. Gillespie, near Witten's Mill, across the divides and down Bluestone River by way of A. St. Clair's, to the corporate limits of the town of Graham, near Hockman (except about 2 miles over the divides), a distance of about 11 miles, 8 miles of which from A. St. Clair's west to said Gillespie's farm, to be macadamized to the width of 10 feet, and about 3 miles from A. St. Clair's to the corporate limits of the town of Graham to be macadamized 12 feet in width.

4—From A. St. Clair's intersecting with the road mentioned in the third paragraph, by way of St. Clair's crossing and Graham cemetery, to the corporate limits of the town of Graham, near Key's planing mill, a distance of about 3 miles, to be macadamized to the width of 12 feet.

5—From Fall's Mills east up Bluestone River, towards the town of Graham, a distance of 1 1/2 miles, to be macadamized to the width of 10 feet.

6—From Fall's Mills west up Mud Fork, a distance of 1 1/2 miles, to be macadamized 10 feet in width.

7—From Gratton west to the Jeffersonville district line about 1 1/2 miles, to be macadamized 10 feet in width.

8—From Gratton to Burke's Garden and in Burke's Garden a distance of about 7 miles, to be macadamized to the width of 10 feet.

9—From Gratton to Crabtree's Gap, down Clear Fork, a distance of about 4 1/2 miles, to be macadamized to the width of 10 feet.

10—From a point near Key's planing mill, at the western corporate

limits of the town of Graham, and connecting with the road from St. Clair's crossing, by way of Graham cemetery, east through the town of Graham to Wister street, and then on east along Wister street to the West Virginia line, a distance of about 1 3/4 miles, to be macadamized 24 feet in width.

11—From the intersection of Morton street with Wister street, in the town of Graham, south along Morton street and up Beaver Pond Branch to the southern corporate limits of the town, a distance of about 1 1/2 miles, to be macadamized to the width of not exceeding 24 feet.

ROADS IN SAID DISTRICT TO BE BUILT AND PERMANENTLY IMPROVED BY MACADAM, OR OTHERWISE THAN BY MACADAM.

1—That part of the road provided for and mentioned under paragraph 3 of "Macadam Roads," running across what is known as the Divides of Bluestone and Clinch Rivers, between J. S. and A. P. Gillespie's farm, near Witten's Mills and A. St. Clair's on Bluestone, a distance of about 2 miles, to be built to the width of not less than 18 feet.

2—From the foot of the ridge near Tip Top, across Stony Ridge and Valley Ridge, via Iron Lithia Springs and Billips store, to a point near Mrs. Harrison's connecting the macadam road provided for in paragraph 2 of "Macadam Roads," a distance of about 4 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

3—From Gratton to Burke's Garden and in Burke's Garden, a distance of about 2 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

4—From the southern corporate limits of the town of Graham on Beaver Pond Creek to Mrs. Walter Sander's residence, about 1 mile, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

5—From Gratton west to the Jeffersonville district line, a distance of about 1 1/2 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

6—From Mrs. Mollie Harrison's residence in Abb's Valley, north to the West Virginia state line, a distance of about 1 1/2 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

7—From end of the Macadam in Abb's Valley, and down Abb's Valley to intersect with St. Clair street, in the town of Pocahontas, a distance of about 4 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

8—From the town of Graham, down Bluestone, by way of Fall's Mills, to the town of Pocahontas, a distance of about 7 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

9—From the terminus of the Macadam road from Fall's Mills, up Mud Fork, to intersect with the Wilson road, a distance of about 3 miles, to be built not less than 18 ft. in width.

10—From Teal's Branch, by way of Bailey, on the Norfolk and Western Railway, to C. Wilson's, in Abb's Valley, a distance of about 7 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

11—From Billip's store on Mud Fork west to the Jeffersonville district line, a distance of about 3 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

12—From Tip Top down Wright's Valley to St. Clair's Crossing, intersecting with the Macadam road, a distance of about 7 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

13—From Will Neal's, on Bluestone, to Mrs. Vacey Sander's residence, a distance of about 2 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

14—From Springville to Tip Top, a distance of about 3 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

15—From Gose's Mill in Burke's Garden east to Sprachers, a distance of about 4 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

16—From Groseclose's store, in Burke's Garden west, a distance of about 1 mile, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

17—From R. E. Goodman's, in Burke's Garden, to Robert Moss's residence, a distance of about 4 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

18—From Joseph Meeks, in Burke's Garden, to George Kelley's residence, a distance of about 3 miles, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

19—From Central church, in Burke's Garden, to Meadow's Valley road, a distance of about 1 mile, to be built to a width of not less than 18 feet.

20—From a point near the mouth of Cove Creek, on Clear Fork, across East River mountain, to the Fincastle road, to connect with same near the brick farm house of A. St. Clair, on Bluestone, a distance of about 8 miles, to be built to the width of not less than 18 feet.

ALL OF SAID ROADS are to be approximately 18 feet in width between the gutters; except where a provision is herein made for a 12 foot macadam, the road shall be of the width of not less than 20 feet between the gutters.

THE RIGHTS OF WAYS of said roads are to be of the width approximately as provided by existing laws, except where the same, as herein provided, may run through the several towns in the said district along streets which have been dedicated to the public, in which cases the rights of ways shall conform to the width of said streets.

The maximum amount of bonds contemplated to be issued for said district and on which said poll shall be taken is Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.) which, it appears to the Court, is an amount not exceeding ten per cent of the total taxable values at this time, in said Clear Fork magisterial district in which roads are to be macadamized, built or permanently improved; and said election officers shall otherwise proceed with said election in the manner required by law and by an Act of the General Assembly approved February 25, 1908, and Acts amendatory thereof, providing for the issuing of bonds for road or bridge improvement and under which this proceeding is had.

ROADS IN SAID DISTRICT TO BE BUILT AND PERMANENTLY IMPROVED BY MACADAM, OR OTHERWISE THAN BY MACADAM.

1—Beginning at the terminus of the macadam road hereinbefore provided for in Thompson's Valley thence down said Valley to the Maiden Spring District line for a distance of about one and one half miles, to a width of not less than 18 feet.

2—Beginning at the end of the macadam road leading up Thompson's Valley from the scales herein before mentioned, up the said valley to G.S. Thompson's place, a distance of about 3 1/2 miles, to be a width of not less than 18 feet.

3—From the forks of the road at John B. Witten's residence, up the creek to the Ed. Thompson brick house, a distance of about 2 1/2 miles, to a width of not less than 18 feet.

4—From the forks of the road at John B. Witten's residence to the macadam road, near what is known as the "Burnt School House," a distance of about 1 mile, to be a width of not less than 18 feet.

5—From the forks of the road at John B. Witten's residence to intersect with the macadam road leading down O'Possum Hollow hereinbefore mentioned, a distance of about one and one half miles, to be of a width not less than 18 feet.

6—From the main Thompson's Valley road, by way of Pleasant Hill church to Thompson's Valley creek, thence up the said creek so as to intersect with the O'Possum Hollow road, a distance of about two and one fourth miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

7—From the Maiden Spring district line in Poor Valley, up the said valley to near John A. Neal's residence, a distance of three and three fourths miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

8—From the forks of the road at J. A. Crockett's residence north to intersect with the river road near Pisgah church, a distance of about one and three fourths miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

9—From the end of the macadam road at the John Peery place to the Maiden Spring district line, a distance of about two and one half miles, to be of not less than 18 feet.

10—Beginning at the terminus of the next preceding road and running a southerly direction up Desklin's Branch, for a distance of 1 mile, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

11—Beginning at G.M. Graybeal's store on Clinch River, crossing the ridge and intersecting with the Baptist Valley road west of the Gap Store, a distance of about one and one half miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

12—Beginning at Gap Store; thence down Baptist Valley to the Maiden Spring district line, a distance of about 1 mile, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

13—Beginning near the Dave Froe place on Mud Fork; thence west to

16—From Tom Brown's place in a northerly direction to the West Virginia State line; on Jacob's Fork, a distance of about three and one half miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

17—From the forks of the road in Crockett's Cove; thence down the Laurel Fork to the Dry Fork, a distance of about 5 miles, to a width of not less than 18 feet.

18—From the Gap Store in Baptist Valley, down the Dry Fork to the State line, a distance of about 7 miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

19—From Dry Fork to Beech Fork; thence up the Beech Fork to the Maiden Spring district line, a distance of about four and one half miles, to a width of not less than 18 feet.

20—From the Dry Fork road, at the mouth of Ray's Fork, thence up the Ray's Fork to the Maiden Spring district line, a distance of about one half mile, to a width of not less than 18 feet.

21—From Adria down Dry Fork to the foot of the Jump, a distance of about two and one half miles, to a width of not less than 18 feet.

22—From Alec Harman's place on Cavitt's Creek, in a south easterly direction to Five Oaks, a distance of about two and one half miles, to be a width of not less than 18 feet.

23—From C. H. Reynold's place on Cavitt's Creek, to the Baptist Church on said creek, a distance of about 1 mile, to be a width of not less than 18 feet.

24—From the end of the macadam road on Cavitt's Creek, near Healing Springs to J. P. Whitman's place in Horsepen Cove; thence east to the Clear Fork district line on Horsepen Creek, a distance of about 8 miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

14—Beginning near the Dave Froe place on Mud Fork; thence southward to intersect with the macadam road north of Witten's Mills, a distance of about 3 miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

15—Beginning at Preston Peery's place in a southeasterly direction to the forks of the road, near John Peery's place, a distance of about one half mile, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

16—From Tom Brown's place in a northerly direction to the West Virginia State line; on Jacob's Fork, a distance of about three and one half miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

17—From the forks of the road in Crockett's Cove; thence down the Laurel Fork to the Dry Fork, a distance of about 5 miles, to a width of not less than 18 feet.

18—From the Gap Store in Baptist Valley, down the Dry Fork to the State line, a distance of about 7 miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

19—From Dry Fork to Beech Fork; thence up the Beech Fork to the Maiden Spring district line, a distance of about four and one half miles, to a width of not less than 18 feet.

20—From the Dry Fork road, at the mouth of Ray's Fork, thence up the Ray's Fork to the Maiden Spring district line, a distance of about one half mile, to a width of not less than 18 feet.

21—From Adria down Dry Fork to the foot of the Jump, a distance of about two and one half miles, to a width of not less than 18 feet.

22—From Alec Harman's place on Cavitt's Creek, in a south easterly direction to Five Oaks, a distance of about two and one half miles, to be a width of not less than 18 feet.

23—From C. H. Reynold's place on Cavitt's Creek, to the Baptist Church on said creek, a distance of about 1 mile, to be a width of not less than 18 feet.

24—From the end of the macadam road on Cavitt's Creek, near Healing Springs to J. P. Whitman's place in Horsepen Cove; thence east to the Clear Fork district line on Horsepen Creek, a distance of about 8 miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

25—From the terminus of the macadam road leading up Whitley's branch from Tazewell depot, to connect with the macadam road at the foot of Whitley's ridge, on the north side, a distance of about 1 mile, to be a width of not less than 18 feet.

ALL OF SAID ROADS are to be approximately 18 feet in width between the gutters; except where a provision is herein made for a 12 foot macadam, the road shall be of the width of not less than 20 feet between the gutters.

THE RIGHTS OF WAY of said road are to be of the width approximately as provided by existing laws, except where the same, as herein provided, may run through the several towns in the said district along streets which have been dedicated to the public, in which cases the rights of ways shall conform to the width of said streets.

This day came the petitioners, a majority of the Board of Supervisors of Tazewell County, and fifty freeholders of the Jeffersonville magisterial district and presented their petition to this Court praying an election in the Jeffersonville magisterial district of Tazewell County, and in Tazewell County, to determine whether or not the Board of Supervisors of said County of Tazewell shall issue bonds of said County of Tazewell for the purpose of macadamizing or otherwise permanently improving the public roads and bridges of the said Jeffersonville magisterial district of said County; and, it appearing to the Court that said petition is signed by a majority of the Board of Supervisors of Tazewell County and by at least fifty freeholders of the Jeffersonville magisterial district of said County, and that said petition is in proper form; that the approximate location, length and width of the roads of said district proposed to be macadamized, built, or permanently improved are set out in said petition, and that all of the requirements of the law have been complied with, IT IS ORDERED that the regular judges of election for Tazewell County on Tuesday, the 18th day of April, 1911, (which time is more than 30 days from the entering of this order), shall open a poll at the respective voting precincts of said County and take the sense of the qualified voters of the County and of said district, on the question whether the Board of Supervisors shall issue bonds of said County for the macadamizing, building or otherwise permanently improving the public roads of said Jeffersonville magisterial district of said County, the approximate location and width of such roads as are proposed to be macadamized or otherwise permanently built and improved, being as follows:

ROADS TO BE MACADAMIZED OR OTHERWISE PERMANENTLY IMPROVED IN MAIDEN SPRING MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

1—Beginning at Jeffersonville magisterial district line near Baptist church, at J. G. Bundy's place, and running a westerly direction by way of Maiden Spring, and along the old Fincastle turnpike road, to such point as 6 miles in distance of new macadam road will extend, excluding the 3 miles of macadam road recently constructed on parts of said turnpike road, and the macadam to be approximately 12 feet in width.

2—From forks of road at Liberty Hill by way of Robert Barnes' old brick residence, a distance of 1 mile, and macadam to be approximately 12 feet in width.

3—From forks of road near residence of Rees T. Bowen to residence of W. J. Gillespie, by way of Snapps, so as to construct 3 miles of macadam road between said two points, and to be macadamized to a width of approximately 12 feet.

4—From forks of road near Mrs. Lucy White's, up Wards Cove, a distance of one and one half miles, and macadam to be approximately 12 feet in width.

5—Beginning at Raven, thence in an easterly direction by way of Richlands to the bridge at McGuire's old store, at the mouth of Middle Creek, so as to construct five and one half miles of macadam road between said two points, and to be macadamized to the width of approximately 12 feet.

6—Beginning at the Jeffersonville magisterial district line in Baptist Valley, thence in a westerly direction by way of Busthead, in the direction of Cedar Bluff, so as to construct three and one half miles of macadam road along said road, and then beginning at ford of Indian Creek, near Dr. W. E. Baylor's residence, then easterly in the direction of Busthead 1 mile, and to be macadamized to the width of approximately 12 feet.

7—Beginning at Norfolk and Western Railway station, at Cedar Bluff by way of Wardell, and running thence towards the forks of the road, east of the residence of Henry Ascue so as to construct seven and one half miles of macadam road between said points, and to be macadamized to the width of approximately 12 feet.

8—Beginning at the Norfolk and Western Railway station at Roundling Mill along the road to Clay Pool Hill, a distance of one and one half miles, and to be macadamized to a width of approximately 12 feet.

9—Beginning at the forks of the road at the old John Thomas residence, thence up Pounding Mill Branch 1 mile and to be macadamized to a width of approximately 12 feet.

10—Beginning at Richlands and extending in a southerly direction towards G. N. Branch, a distance of one and one half miles and to be macadamized to a width of approximately 12 feet.

11—Beginning at Richlands and running up Big Creek road, in the direction of Coaland, a distance of approximately 5 miles, to such point as the cost of construction will not exceed \$5,000, the object being to expend this amount on this road.

12—Beginning at Smyth County line near Laurel Fork mill, and running up Poor Valley, a distance of approximately 4 miles, towards Jeffersonville magisterial district, to such point as the cost of construction will not exceed \$3,000, the object being to expend this amount on this road.

ALL OF SAID ROADS are to be approximately 18 feet in width between the gutters; except where a provision is herein made for a 12 foot macadam, the road shall be of the width of not less than 20 feet between the gutters.

ROADS TO BE MACADAMIZED OR OTHERWISE PERMANENTLY IMPROVED IN MAIDEN SPRING MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

1—Beginning at the terminus of the macadam road hereinbefore provided for in Thompson's Valley thence down said Valley to the Maiden Spring District line for a distance of about one and one half miles, to a width of not less than 18 feet.

2—Beginning at the end of the macadam road leading up Thompson's Valley from the scales herein before mentioned, up the said valley to G.S. Thompson's place, a distance of about 3 1/2 miles, to be a width of not less than 18 feet.

3—From the forks of the road at John B. Witten's residence, up the creek to the Ed. Thompson brick house, a distance of about 2 1/2 miles, to a width of not less than 18 feet.

4—From the forks of the road at John B. Witten's residence to the macadam road, near what is known as the "Burnt School House," a distance of about 1 mile, to be a width of not less than 18 feet.

5—From the forks of the road at John B. Witten's residence to intersect with the macadam road leading down O'Possum Hollow hereinbefore mentioned, a distance of about one and one half miles, to be of a width not less than 18 feet.

6—From the main Thompson's Valley road, by way of Pleasant Hill church to Thompson's Valley creek, thence up the said creek so as to intersect with the O'Possum Hollow road, a distance of about two and one fourth miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

7—From the Maiden Spring district line in Poor Valley, up the said valley to near John A. Neal's residence, a distance of three and three fourths miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

8—From the forks of the road at J. A. Crockett's residence north to intersect with the river road near Pisgah church, a distance of about one and three fourths miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

9—From the end of the macadam road at the John Peery place to the Maiden Spring district line, a distance of about two and one half miles, to be of not less than 18 feet.

10—Beginning at the terminus of the next preceding road and running a southerly direction up Desklin's Branch, for a distance of 1 mile, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

11—Beginning at G.M. Graybeal's store on Clinch River, crossing the ridge and intersecting with the Baptist Valley road west of the Gap Store, a distance of about one and one half miles, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

12—Beginning at Gap Store; thence down Baptist Valley to the Maiden Spring district line, a distance of about 1 mile, to be of a width of not less than 18 feet.

13—Beginning near the Dave Froe place on Mud Fork; thence west to
