Fighting Army Worm
Washington, July 24.—The House Committee on Agriculture today recommended an immediate appropriation of \$5,000 to stop the ravages of the army worm in the Southern States. Secretary Wilson asked for it.
Representative Heflin, of Alabama, told the committee the worm was stopping railway trains in his district. The committee will try to rush the appropriation through before the agricultural appropriation bill is agreed upon.
Because of the delay of Congress in passing the agricultural appropriation bill, Secretary Wilson and Representative Aiken, of South Carolina, have taken money from their own pockets to pay the traveling expenses of F. M. Webster, expert entomologist, who has gone south to investigate an outbreak of the army worm on the corn and cotton crops.
Word was received from Professor Webster at Anderson, S. C., that the pest was doing much more damage than he had expected. South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, Tennessee and Mississippi are the States in which the worm has already appeared to an alarming degree. The last previous serious outbreak of the sort was about ten years ago.

Man's Inhumanity to Poultry
(Evening Journal.)
Science commits her felonies no less than humankind. Even those of us who have learned to tolerate vivisection can find her guilty of many other crimes.
In this connection we have always thought that an apology was due somewhere to the chickens hatched in incubators. These congenial orphans are forced into the world without hope of ever knowing a mother's care or even indulging in mild braggadocio concerning their family tree. They are little better off than the mule who, as has been pathetically said, is "without pride of ancestry or hope of offspring."
But to return to the chickens a moment. While the incubator, on one hand, necessarily has a tendency to make hens frivolous and to relieve them from the responsibilities of maternity, the hen, in another way, is as grossly imposed upon as the artificially hatched chick.
It is the editor of Farm and Fireside who has put this resentful thought into our minds.
Speaking about geese—the feathered kind of the feminine persuasion—he says that they make very "poor mothers." According to him, they are cross and irritable with their goslings and frequently peck the youngsters out of their shells before they are ready to hatch.
Hence has come about the practice of hatching goose eggs under hens. Now at the first blush—the first blush of the anserine "mothers," one might say—it would seem that this is not unjust. But closer investigation shows that the hen does not get a fair deal.
However conscientious Biddy may be, she knows full well from barnyard gossip that no hen is expected to set—we believe we ought to say "sit"—more than twenty-one days.
But when she gets on the goose-egg job her period of incubation is "preternaturally extended," and she has to retire from society for period ranging from twenty-eight to thirty-two days. Nor can she conveniently cover more than five or seven eggs, and the goslings, when hatched, soon become indifferent to parental care.
In fact, the raising of a family of young geese is a continual strain and anxiety, without even a suggestion of filial gratitude or anything to encourage the hen.
The best she can do is to extract such encouragement as she can from the belief that she is a martyr. That always helps, although it does not altogether compensate.
