Theatrical News Notes

There is nothing better than a good play to theatre goers, and to the players there is nothing better than a good attendance from a financial standpoint, and an appreciative audience from a critical standpoint. In the presentation of "Sherlock Holmes," at the Grand, Friday night, all these three combined to make the evening long to be remembered.

As everybody knows, "Sherlock Holmes" is full of surprises in his interesting novels, and the audience expected many surprising climaxes, but they were not looking for the whole house to be thrown into complete darkness to begin with. But it was all done for scenic effect and was thrilling and hair raising. This darkening of the house was continued, at the commencing and closing of every act and scene, throughout the entire performance.

When the curtain raised and the lights thrown on the first act, the scene represents the drawing room in the residence of Mr. James Larrabee and his wife, Madge, a pair of adventurers. While at Hamburg this couple have met Alice Paulkner, whose sister became the victim of a man of royal blood, and who, on her death bed, gives to Alice certain letters and photographs that will convict the betrayer, who is near the eye of his marriage. This package of letters and photographs is very much desired by the young nobleman and has employed the notorious detective, Sherlock Holmes, and his able assistants, to recover the same. The Larrabees also wish to secure this package for blackmailing purposes, and resort to every desperate means to accomplish their end. This is the story of the play. The Larrabees have the aid of the basest criminals and thugs of all England. Among them is one Moriarity, who is the chief of these men of shady work. He has never met Holmes, but has felt the hand of this great detective, who has thwarted his

devilish work in times past, so Moriarity becomes the conspirator to down Holmes for nothing but sweet revenge's sake, and is utterly defeated in every strategic move. At the first meeting of Holmes and Alice, in the drawing room, by his wondrous skill, finds this package, but falls in love with the young lady and returns it to her. He makes sure, however, that it is safe in her keeping. A counterfeit package has been made by the conspirators and this is sold to Holmes, who delivers it to his clients. The counterfeits of the package is at once discovered by them and they demand an explanation. The detective can only admit that he has lost in the game. At this point, Alice, who has fallen in love with Holmes, comes to the rescue and by giving the true package to Holmes, saves his reputation. Right here one of the prettiest love-scenes ever produced upon the stage is enacted between these two, that is better seen than described, which ends the play.

The company is an exceptionally strong one, and was many times warmly applauded.
