THE NEW ADDRESS.
The acquisition of Harrison county, at their recent session, ordered that there be established and made a free McAdams road extending from the North boundary of the corporate limits of the town of New Athens to the Belmont county line one and seven eighth miles so as to connect with the McAdams road running from St. Clairsville in said county to the above named line. This will give a continuous pike from St. Clairsville to New Athens a distance of about ten miles. The estimated cost of constructing the road from New Athens to the Belmont county line is seven thousand dollars. No damages have been claimed by the land holders along the route. James J. Billingsley, Jacob Moore and John C. Flossman were by the commissioners appointed a commission to estimate upon a view of the premises, and apportion the estimated expenses of said improvement upon the real property embraced within the assessment limit, which is two miles from each side of said pike and the Northern terminus of the same. In addition to the town of New Athens the realty embraced and upon which the assessment fall will amount to about four thousand, seven hundred and twenty acres of land. Jacob Jarvis has been appointed Engineer of said road. It is the purpose we understand, to put the construction of the road under contract as soon as possible. It is obvious that the continuance of this road to Cadiz would subserve the interests of Cadiz and Athens townships. In fact the general interests of the county require its further construction. It requires but little foresight to see which way much of the trade which naturally belongs to Cadiz will go, if our people do not wake up and work for the improvement of the means of travel and transportation to and from the town.
