New complications in the strange disappearance of Mr. George S. Maxwell, until recently general manager of the Mason Telephone Company, were developed yesterday to such extent as to throw a veil of mystery over the whole affair, and now it has assumed the shape of one of the most remarkable problems with which reporters, newspaper correspondents, and a detective or two have wrestled for many a day.

That there are two men, cousins of each other, by the name of George S. Maxwell, both connected with the telephone business, both hailing from Louisville, Ky., and both abruptly leaving the city, and so successfully concerning their whereabouts, seems to be little less than preposterous.

On October 31, a man registering as G. S. Maxwell, of Kentucky, and stating that he was from Louisville, registered at the Exchange Hotel. He was about six feet high, slender build, and had dark hair, dark eyes, a straight nose, a thin mustache, and a nervous manner.

At the same time there is every reason to believe that the letter was not written by Mr. Maxwell himself, but was either dictated or written out by a third party, more probably the latter.

It is well known that when a man is registering at a hotel, and is accompanied by his wife and children, he himself stands in an erect position and signs his name in a bold, manly hand.

There is no reason why G. S. Maxwell, formerly of the Mason Company, could not board at both the St. Claire Hotel and the Exchange Hotel at the same time.

Richmond, Va., Nov. 9, 1895. To Captain Charles H. Epps, Sergeant of Richmond City, and Keeper of the Jail: Do not deliver the Lunenburg convicts to the Sheriff of Lunenburg county.

All day yesterday the case of the prisoners was discussed by the Governor, Attorney-General, and counsel for the women, and it was not until late in the night that the Governor O'Ferrall arrived at the fixed determination not to allow the prisoners to go.

The prisoners will not be taken back to Lunenburg county to-day. The Governor O'Ferrall has decided to protect the citizens of Virginia and he will do it.

After these orders had been executed the Governor explained that he had come to the conclusion that the law of the State required him to do so.
