JUDGE B. T. GUNTER DEAD

AN ABLE ADVOCATE, INVINCIBLE DEBATER, DISTINGUISHED JURIST

He Was Colonel of Accomac Troops and Defeated the Penitentiary Against Federal Troops—The Funeral—His Successor

Judge Benjamin T. Gunter, whose illness was noted from time to time in this paper, died Sunday at the Maryland University Hospital, in Baltimore.

He was born in Accomac county, Va., February 11, 1831, his parents belonging to sterling Eastern Shore families.

He was educated at Richmond College and the University of Virginia, studying law at the latter institution.

While acting in this capacity it fell to his lot to prosecute Tully Lilliston, and the late Senator James S. Braxton, for killing Thomas Hudd, near Accomac Courthouse.
