

POSSIBILITIES OF THE JAMES RIVER.

No Reason Why It Cannot Equal the River Clyde as a Waterway. THAT WAS ORIGINALLY A CREEK. But Scientific Engineering Has Created a Channel Which Furnish a Way for Vessels of the Largest Draught—Some Statistics.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19.—Special.—In connection with the possibilities of deepening the channel of James river, mention was made in this correspondence several weeks ago of the fact that the River Clyde was practically created out of a small creek by engineers.

A FRUITFUL SUBJECT. In giving the summary of the paper the correspondent of Engineering says: "The subject (the River Clyde) is one extremely fruitful, for there is no river in the world which, for its size at any rate, has done so much for the world as the Clyde."
