WAS A COURIER OF WASHINGTON

This Post Filled by Ebenezer Parker, Who Was Buried in St. John's Cemetery in 1775.

Mr. Antonio Grafigna, the polite superintendent of historic old St. John's cemetery, has received from the Massachusetts branch of the Society of Sons of the American Revolution a short sketch of Ebenezer Parker, who, it has recently been learned, was buried in that cemetery in 1775. A committee representing the Society of Sons of the American Revolution and located the grave of Parker, which is near the keeper's office. They put a tablet over the grave with the following inscription: "Revolutionary grave marker, erected by the Society of the Sons of the American Revolution."

The letter received by Superintendent Grafigna says the records show that Ebenezer Parker was born in Westford, Mass., June 20, 1750, and was a soldier in the Revolutionary army. He was in the battle of Bunker Hill, and was also a courier at the headquarters of George Washington.
