

ITALY REGARDED WITH SUSPICION

German Sentiment Over Foreign Politics is Despondent.

DREIBUND WILL BE RENEWED.

Von Waldersee Said to Be Responsible for Emperor's Uncompromising Attitude Toward China—Opinion That Our Control of Canal Cannot be Tolerated.

(By Associated Press.) BERLIN, April 20.—Regarding foreign politics the sentiment in German political and official circles is rather despondent just now.

The Emperor's attitude toward China is regarded here as a serious matter. It is considered certain that Italy will insist on the alteration of certain paragraphs in the Dreibund agreement, and it is also certain that Italy's reappraisal with France is regarded here unfavorably.

UNIVERSAL HATRED.

The Kreuz Zeitung wonders why there is this universal hatred against Germany, including that of the United States, as evinced commercially and by frequent hostile attitudes of the United States toward Germany in China.

It is learned upon reliable authority that Prince Hohenzollern, since his return to Berlin, has not only several leading personages that it was Field Marshal Count von Waldersee who, more than Count von Buelow, had urged the Emperor to take an uncompromising attitude against China, and who had especially advised these phrases of the German-Chinese policy which harmed the entire world.

THE NICARAGUA CANAL.

The Nicaragua canal has been discussed by the New York press, which is unanimously of the opinion that neither Great Britain nor Germany can tolerate exclusive control of the canal by the United States.

THINKS AGUINALDO'S MANIFESTO CLEARLY YIELDING TO FORCE.

KANSAS CITY, MO., April 20.—Senator Charles A. Towne, of Minnesota, was shown a copy of Aguinaldo's proclamation last night. He said: "It is clearly the utterance of a man who yields only to force, and considering the occurrence of the past two years, it constitutes one of the most pathetic incidents in history."
