AMERICAN VICTORY. Insurgents Attacked Garrison While at Breakfast, but Were Beaten. (By Associated Press.) MANILA, November 10.—Major William L. Ricketts, of the Eighth Regiment of Infantry, commanding the Major's expedition, reports that the garrison of Abra de Ilog was attacked yesterday by a force of insurgents commanded by Lenocos. The Filipinos apparently attempted to repeat the Samar tactics, but the Americans, who were breakfasting fully armed, completely routed the insurgents, who left five men dead on the field, each having a rifle and ammunition. One American was seriously wounded.
