

AMOUNTS PAID IN PENSIONS UNDER THE LAST TWO LAWS

Detailed Statement Showing the Number of Pensioners and the Amounts For Each County in the State.

The Senate has ordered to be printed a list of the counties and cities of the State, with the number of Confederate pensioners in each. The list was prepared in the Auditor's office. It gives the population of each county and city according to the census of 1880, and also, the number of pensions in each county and city, and the amount paid out for pensions in each under the old pension law of 1880, and also, under the Parks law of 1898.

1888 last year received an average of \$28.66 each, while the 8,060 Parks bill pensioners received only an average of \$3.94 each. If the Parks bill pensioners had received the same average as the others the appropriation necessary for both would have been \$23,292.54.
