Witnesses Tell of H's Campaign in the Island of Samar. (By Associated Press.) MANILA, January 7.—Two natives, former officials of Calbayog, Island of Samar, were the only witnesses at the trial to-day of Major Edwin F. Glenn, of the Fifth Infantry, who is charged with unlawfully and willfully killing seven prisoners of war. The witnesses told of Major Glenn's arrival at Calbayog and of his directing the citizens of that place to assemble in his office. He said this pacification was in their hands, and directed them to go out and confer with the insurgents. He warned the citizens that if the insurgents failed to surrender they would be used as guides to conduct the American column against the enemy.
