

DIRECTORS SUED

To Recover Dividends Declared By Alexander's Bank.

Paris, Ky., July 18.—Thomas J. Smith Banking Commissioner of the State of Kentucky, and Buckner Woodford, Special Deputy Banking Commissioner in charge of the defunct George Alexander & Co. state bank, through their attorney, John J. Williams today filed with the Circuit Court Clerk W. C. Webb suits against the Directors of the Alexander bank to recover for alleged illegal dividends declared. The petition cites that on June 29, 1907, the defendants at a meeting held in the banking office, declared a semi-annual dividend on its capital stock of 8 per cent, amounting to \$3,200. The papers filed contain 15 paragraphs, each representing a dividend of \$3,200 and aggregating a sum of \$48,000, for which the plaintiffs allege the defendant Directors are liable.
