STRIKE THREE! OUT! ANOTHER BLOW DEALT "BIRTH OF A NATION"

Columbus, Ohio, June 24—The Supreme Court today dismissed the case of the Epoch Producing Company of New York against the Industrial Commission of Ohio in which the right of the company to exhibit "The Birth of a Nation", a moving picture play depicting conditions in the South following the Civil War, was to be tested.

The Court held its decision on the case would be unnecessary, because a case involving the same question is now pending in the Federal Court here.

The Ohio Board of Moving Picture Censors, a part of the Industrial Commission, rejected the film play, declaring it was conducive of race prejudice.

Attorney General Turner says he will file a motion forthwith in the State Supreme Court, asking that it reconsider its action in dismissing the case and set the case down for hearing on its merits. If this motion is refused attorneys say they do not know how the case can be brought to trial. It may be that all suits will have to be withdrawn and a new suit instituted in the State Supreme Court, it is said.

KILLING OF TWO AMERICAN CATTLEMEN BY MEXICANS IN SONORA ANNOUNCED BY OFFICIALS

Douglas, Ariz., June 25—William Robertson and Tom Snyder, American cattlemen, have been killed by Mexicans southwest of Nacozari, Sonora, according to the statement today of military officials from Agua Prieta. Officials at Arispe have telegraphed General P. Elias Calles confirming the death of A. R. Dickson, a British subject, who was wounded in the fight with Mexican cowboys in which Jim Parks, an American prospector, was killed.
