SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON MAY 16, 1920. Topic: Victory Under Samuel. 1 Sam. 7:12-17. REV. J. J. DICKEY.

Israel had not been under the domination of the Philistines for twenty years. Samuel, in the mean time, had grown to manhood and had risen to the head of the nation. The people, weary of servitude, longed for deliverance from their oppressors. Their miserable condition led them to think upon their ways, and then they began to "lament after the Lord." At this juncture Samuel reminded them that if they wanted the help of the Lord in their material affairs they must turn from their sins. "God is angry with the wicked every day." They must quit their idolatry "and return to God with all their hearts, and serve Him only," before God would come to their rescue.

This is God's rule today, with the nations and with individuals. Samuel called representatives of the nation together at Mizpah, and held a great revival. The people confessed their sins and Samuel prayed for them. The Philistines mobilized their army and came forth for battle. The Israelites were frightened and begged Samuel to pray for their safety. Samuel offered a burnt offering and continued to cry unto the Lord. It seems they were not prepared to meet the Philistine army. So the Lord thundered with a great thunder on that day upon the Philistines and discomfited them, and they were smitten before Israel. When the first decisive battle was fought, in France, with great odds against the Allies, General Kitchener remarked: "Somebody has prayed."

Great prayers make great leaders. There is a God who hears prayer and gives deliverance, when men turn to Him with penitence. Samuel ruled Israel forty years, but the Philistines troubled them no more, during his administration.

The lesson is plain. National security is found alone in divine protection. "Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord."

THE MORROW TWINS AT LEXINGTON.

The Morrow twins, Governor Edwin and Colonel Charles, will meet in Lexington Sunday for the first time since the Kentucky chief executive's brother went into active service in the war against Germany.

MANUFACTURERS TO HOLD SILVER JUBILEE MEETING

Will Start the Convention with the Final Shaping of Platform For Industry.

New York, May 15.—The twenty-fifth annual convention — the Silver Jubilee—of the National Association of Manufacturers of the United States, will open Monday morning at the Waldorf-Astoria.

Preliminary to the general sessions of the three-day conference attended by leading manufacturers of the country, the platform committee, composed of delegates appointed by each individual state, will meet to whip into final shape for presentation to the convention as a whole Tuesday night the "Platform for American Industry." More than 5,400 manufacturers of the country, employing above 6,000,000 workers, will endorse this platform and forward it to the dominant political parties in their conventions that they may know fully industry's position on vital problems facing the nation.

Speakers who will address the convention have been chosen for their knowledge of important questions which industry is striving to solve, and among the topics to be discussed are such important questions as "The Relations of Government to the Manufacturers," "International Exchange," "An Immigration Policy," "The Open Shop in Relation to American Democracy" and "What are the Dangers if Inflation Continues?" "Old Home Night," in which the charter members of the Association will regale their younger fellow members with tales of "the old days" will be held Monday night, and the convention will close with a "Silver Jubilee Banquet" on Wednesday evening.


