MAYSVILLE MAN MAY HEAD THE C. & O.

Garrett Wall, of this City, is Being Tipped as the Probable Successor of Late President Stevens.

Mr. Garrett B. Wall, of this city, for years the right-hand man of the late George W. Stevens, President of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Company, is being tipped to be president of the company. He is vice-president of the company in charge of executive matters.

President George W. Stevens died at White Sulphur Springs, W. Va., suddenly about two weeks ago and the matter of selecting a new head has been under consideration ever since.

There are several names mentioned for the position, among them being C. E. Graham, senior vice-president, and F. M. Whitaker, vice-president in charge of traffic.

Mr. Wall has been with the road for many years and is said to be largely responsible for the vast extensions heretofore made and now being made in the coal regions in the Big Sandy Valley.

The Ledger yesterday was advised upon reliable authority that Mr. C. E. Graham has been elected president, and so published it. This now seems to have been an error as the election has not yet taken place. The selection will probably be made this week.

A Ford machine, belonging to unknown owners, lost a wheel at corner of Second and Market streets today at noon, and remained there for about an hour before repairmen from local garage were able to move it. No other damage was done.

THIRD SUIT AGAINST FAYETTE TRACTION CO.

Making a Total of \$100,000 Damages Asked For the Killed and Injured in Recent Accident.

Asking damages of \$30,000 for the death of Mrs. Elizabeth S. Craig, who was killed when an interurban car struck an automobile several weeks ago on the Georgetown pike, the executor of Mrs. Craig's estate filed suit Monday in the office of the Fayette Circuit Clerk against the Kentucky Traction and Terminal Company, joining Taylor and Samuel Marmer, motorman and conductor of the car.

This makes a total of \$100,000 that is sought from the company as a result of the accident, suits having previously been filed by Dr. R. H. Stevenson, for \$20,000 damages and by the administrators of the estate of Mrs. Judith A. Rice, of this city, for \$50,000.

Mrs. Warner in answer to questions denied that she had given the children any poison and said she did not know of anybody who might have given them poison.

HARDING IS INVITED TO VISIT MEXICO

Is Giving Matter Serious Consideration and May Probably Stop at Vera Cruz.

Brownsville, Texas, Nov. 16. — An earnest invitation from Mexican officials to go into Mexico during his voyage in Southern waters has been taken under advisement by President-elect Warren G. Harding.

Should he accept, his visit probably would be limited to a short stop at Vera Cruz on his way from New Orleans to the Canal Zone. He had been asked to go to Mexico City, but is understood to consider so extensive a trip impossible because of engagements elsewhere.

The invitation was brought to Brownsville by Elias Torres, who said that in urging its acceptance he spoke both for the Mexican foreign office and for General Alvaro Obregon, the Mexican president-elect. In an hour's conference with the Senator, who was spending here the last day of his Texas vacation, Mr. Torres made a special plea that the Senator be present at Obregon's inauguration in the Mexican capital on November 20.
