SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON.
JUNE 5, 1921.
Topic: "Making the Nation Christian." Psalm 33:12; Proverbs 14:34; Romans 13:1-7.
REV. J. J. DICKEY.

A Christian nation is one that recognizes the divinity and divination of Jesus Christ. Such a nation will frame its laws from His teachings, and administer the government according to the principles laid down in the Word of God. It is a truism to say that where all the citizens are Christians, in a personal sense, that we have a Christian nation.

We have heathen nations, Mohammedan nations and a Jewish nation, so named from the religion they profess. Christianity is always on the side of government. Anarchy and Christianity are antipodal. Anarchy is always atheistic. As soon as the Bolsheviks overthrew government in Russia they attacked the church, and sought to destroy the prevalent system of religion. A Christian nation is one that recognizes the authority of the Bible, since the Bible is the charter of liberty. It recognizes the authority of human governments and teaches that men be "subject to the powers that be," declaring that "they are ordained of God." Yet this is not to be

construed as denying the right of revolution.

Our topic is "Making the Nation Christian." Perhaps by this is meant, "How to make the citizens of a nation Christians." To make Christians of the citizens will certainly make a nation Christian. This is especially true under a republican form of government, for where people make their own laws they simply crystallize their sentiments into statutes. To make a nation Christian the people must be taught Christianity. This is the course the Christian world is pursuing to make the heathen nations of the world Christian. The missionary takes his Bible in hand and tells the people what it teaches concerning religion, morals and government. He translates the Bible into the languages of the natives. He introduced the literature of the Bible, and by tongue and press he teaches the people the great fundamental doctrines of Christianity. This never fails to produce results. As the people become converts the laws of the country are changed into harmony with this teaching, and gradually the nation becomes Christian. As the character and lives of the people are changed the nation is changed and this change will be exhibited in the changing of their laws. The laws will be characterized by equity, justice, righteousness. The form of government may not be changed. It requires holy men to make a nation holy. The great leaders who have changed the moral character of nations have been godly men of high moral character, fearless and devoted

EARL HUNTSMAN DIES.
Frankfort, Ky., June 4. — Earl Huntsman, forty years old, of Scottsville, developer of the Allen county oil field, and one of the most prominent Republican politicians in Kentucky, died Thursday in Scottsville, after an illness of several months.

Coming to Frankfort in 1908 as a clerk in the office of Frank P. James, State Auditor, Huntsman soon was appointed to be revenue agent for the state-at-large.

During his administration he collected more than \$1,000,000 in delinquent taxes, chief among which were the warehouse storage accounts. He was elected to the Legislature in 1914 and was the principal Republican advisor during the session.
